**ORDINANCE NO. 9-2007**  
**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 108 FIRE PREVENTION**  
**REQUIRING RAPID ENTRY SYSTEMS IN VARIOUS**  
**BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that the following be included in Chapter 108 known as Fire Prevention:

WHEREAS, authorized personnel of the Borough of Sea bright have previously carried keys to numerous establishments throughout

the Borough, with the owners permission, in order to gain access in the event of emergencies, including but not limited to activation of fire alarms and reports of fire; and

WHEREAS, This system has become outdated, cumbersome and inefficient, resulting in unnecessary delays in providing service and unnecessary damage to structures in order to gain access to buildings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the general police powers under N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 and the authority of the Borough of Sea Bright Council to enact ordinances for fire prevention under N.J.S.A. 40:49-5.1, the Borough of Sea Bright Council has determined that it is in the best interests for public safety and protection of property of the residents of the Borough and the members of its Fire Departments to establish a uniform system of entry within the Borough of Sea Bright.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The words "building" and/or "structure" as used in this ordinance mean any building and/or structure which have an automatic fire suppression system or fire alarm system, except one family residential dwellings, which are not included.

SECTION 2. The owner, tenant, and/or occupant of said buildings and/or structures are required to have installed a rapid entry box and key system to allow access to the buildings and/or structure and access to boiler rooms, sprinkler control valves, electrical rooms, elevators, elevator control rooms, and other locked areas of premises as may be required by the Bureau of Fire Prevention of the Borough of Sea Bright in which buildings or structures is located. The Bureau of Fire Prevention will make the determination on the basis of immediate need for access in the event of a fire alarm or what appears to be a possible fire emergency.

SECTION 3. The Bureau of Fire Prevention shall prescribe specifications as to the rapid entry box, key system and location.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and publication as required by law. All owners, tenants, and/or occupants subject to this Ordinance shall have one year from the effective date to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Inconsistent Ordinances. All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency.

SECTION 6. Severability. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 7. Penalty. Penalties for violations of the terms of this Ordinance shall be as provided in Chapter I, General Provisions, Article I, Section 1-14 General Penalty.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption, passage and publication according to law and moved the Public Hearing to be held. Second by Councilman Scriven and approved by the following vote:

Councilwoman Fernandes said she received a call from Mrs. Pauxtis regarding the bike tour and she made her aware that she was not on the committee regarding this issue. Councilwoman Fernandes called Councilwoman Long who chairs the Police Committee and spoke to her about their conversation.

Mayor Kalaka-Adams asked if this issue went through the committee. Councilwoman Fernandes said that not every single thing really needs to go through committee. But, everyone knew about the bike tour.

**B.** Councilwoman Long introduced and offered the following Resolution for adoption:

**RESOLUTION NO. 95-2007**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright had previously adopted Resolutions No. 147-2005 and 36-2006 prohibiting foot and bicycle races in the north beach area because of the safety concerns for the participants of these events; and

WHEREAS, a request has been made by Jay Pauxtis to conduct a bicycle event for Timmy's Tour de Shore on October 7, 2007 limiting the registration to 250 bike riders; and

WHEREAS, Jay Pauxtis has met with the Public Safety Official, Chief William Moore, to address the public safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey State Police will be assisting this event as it relates to the traffic concerns during the bicycle ride. Five members of the Troop "C" Tactical Patrol will be assigned to this event; and

WHEREAS, the bike traffic leaving Sandy Hook would head south utilizing NJ State Troopers with their cars positioned at the north end of Ocean Avenue so that motorists would be cautioned. Cyclists would proceed on the sidewalk adjoining the seawall heading south. At the end of the sidewalk, adjoining the seawall cyclists would enter the beach club parking lots. When exiting the beach club parking lots a NJ State Trooper would be deployed at that area to control cyclist traffic allowing them to cross to the side of Ocean Avenue and to facilitate vehicle traffic flow. Bike riders would then ride south on Ocean Avenue to Seven Presidents Park in Long Branch; and

WHEREAS, on returning to Sandy Hook the bike riders would travel north on Ocean Avenue where NJ State Troopers would be strategically located near the Sea Bright Beach Club entrance to divert cyclists back into the beach club parking lots. Bike riders would continue north through these parking lots until they reach the sidewalk adjoining the sea wall. At the end of the northern end of the sidewalk adjoining the seawall bike riders would need to go back onto Route 36 and the entrance ramp to Sandy Hook where a NJ State Trooper vehicle with lights to caution motorists would be located; and

WHEREAS, Chief William Moore of the Sea Bright Police Department has issued a memo indicating that Mr. and Mrs. Pauxtis along with the New Jersey State Police have addressed all of his concerns in an acceptable manner and he finds no reason to deny this event.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright hereby authorize this event.

## **8. NEW BUSINESS:**

**A. Discussion:** Defeated School Budgets - Sea Bright Elementary and Shore Regional High School. Councilwoman Long said that last night the Mayor, Councilman Keeler and she attended a meeting at Shore Regional with representatives of the other member towns. During the meeting, they spoke of the budget mandates coming from Trenton and told Shore Regional that they recognized the costs were contractual.

The towns are seeking budget cuts. Councilwoman Long said that they told Shore Regional they would hire an auditor to review the budget and make line by line recommendations. Shore Regional agreed to do their own internal review and take one hundred thousand dollars off the budget. We will be meeting them possibly next week and we should receive their recommendations this Friday.

Councilwoman Long said that we need to certify our tax levy by May 21 and we need to have it ready by May 15, the next Council meeting.

Mayor Kalaka-Adams said that Sea Bright's Elementary school budget failed because she felt the voters just did not want tax increases. Sea Bright's representatives on the school board said there is no wiggle room left in the budget. We should approve their budget because it is a very tight budget.

Regarding the following Resolution No. 96-2007, Mayor Kalaka-Adams said that the application fee for the joint feasibility study is \$1,000. This would be split between Sea Bright and Monmouth Beach.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that Jersey Professional Management, 23 North Avenue East, Cranford, NJ 07016 be and is hereby appointed to provide the services referenced herein for a SHARE shared service grant application, and that the Mayor and Clerk be and are hereby authorized to execute all documents relevant to this service.
