- C. Monmouth County Board of Elections letter regarding A.D.A. Polling Place Violations. Borough Clerk Smeltzer said that Sea Bright's Police Department were measuring the handicapped parking spots behind Borough Hall. Monmouth County approved the facility and Sea Bright is in compliance with the County's policies. Attorney Arnette said that he and Engineer Hoder have looked over the ADA rules and regulations and their conclusions are more consistent with the County's findings as opposed to the Public Advocate's findings.

11. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A. **Beach/Environment/Cultural Arts:** Councilman Scriven reported that Sea Bright received in revenue \$ 305,206.00 for the 2007 Beach Season. This was a 12.5% increase over last year. On behalf of the Beach Committee , Councilman Scriven thanked Water Safety Director Bill Mack for his efforts.

Councilman Scriven said that the Beach Committee will be soliciting Architects proposals for a new Beach Facility. The design plan would include a new Life Guard Station and an expanded Boardwalk. Based on the findings of a Municipal Pool Feasibility Study a new Pool Club may be included in the design. The designs may include concession spaces that would generate revenue for the Borough.

Councilman Scriven said that the Library received \$ 1,295 in revenue from Sea Bright Day. Sea Bright Library's annual fundraiser dinner/dance will be held at the Quay Restaurant on November 2. 50/50 Raffle Tickets are on sale at the Library.

Environmental Partnership's letter regarding a full environmental impact statement before construction begins to all bridges should be sent to the Governor soon.

Several Environmental Partnership members are concerned with the Borough of Highlands' decision supporting NJDOT position on the Highland Bridge.

B. Public Works/Building Maintenance/Beautification:

Councilwoman Fernandes reported that recently the Public Works Committee continues to work on amending the Bulkhead Ordinance.

New security doors were installed at Cecile F. Norton Community Center.

Engineer David Hoder will seek a time extension to April 2008 from the Department of Environmental Protection regarding Sea Bright's salt storage. Sea Bright and Monmouth Beach are working together on a Shared Services Grant for a salt storage.

Councilwoman Fernandes said that D & D Utility will excavate and repair a hole on Rt. 36's shoulder at no cost since it was repaired once before by them.

Engineer Eric Betz should have the final proposal of the Sea Bright's Hazard Flood Mitigation Plan by next week.

Councilwoman Fernandes said that the DIIP project will proceed without Osborne Place according to the motion of the last Council Meeting. Attorney Arnette, Engineer Hoder and she discussed with the property owners on Osborne Place the easement and those results are inconclusive.

Councilwoman Fernandes said that regarding the DIIP Pump Stations and Generators; she was told by Engineer Eric Betz that it was possible to use one pump generator on Front Street's right of way and still connect a pump on Center Street. Councilman Keeler and Engineer Hoder spoke with JCPL who said it was possible to run wiring from Beach Street under Ocean Avenue and hook it up to Borough Hall's generator. Engineer Hoder says that it would still have to be a larger generator and he will be getting additional information from JCPL.

Councilwoman Fernandes said that she strongly recommends that the Beach Committee hire six more individuals for a beach clean-up crew. A consideration might be to purchase or share with another town a tractor and rake to clean the beach and keep raking restrictions in mind.

Public Works began removing the macadam from the sidewalk area on Ocean Avenue near the library. A sprinkler system will be installed soon and next year the Beautification Committee will start landscaping.

The Planning Board has approved an art studio at 50 Church Street, Jesse Howland's property.

C. Personnel/Office Administration/Court/Public Relations:

Councilwoman Long reported in Councilman Kelly's absence that the Personnel Committee is amending the Personnel Handbook as per Councilwoman Fernandes' request.

D. Finance/Insurance/Flood Control/Capital Projects:

Councilman Keeler said that the temporary cell tower is still in progress.

The Smart Growth Workshop Meeting is scheduled for September 27, 2007 at 6:30 PM.

Sea Bright's Municipal, Police, Fire and First Aid buildings would be assessed for structural, mechanical and electrical engineering analysis by Monteforte Architectural.

E. Fire & First Aid/Emergency Management/Code Enforcement/Recreation:

Councilwoman Bills said that the Fire Department's Field Day would be Sunday, September 30 at 10:00 am. there will be food, refreshments and music.

Councilwoman Bills reported that Fire Chief Kane of Highlands sent his congratulations to Sea Bright's Fire Chief Pat Mason for his Department's outstanding job combating the Shadow Lawn Trailer fire in Highlands. Chief Mason advised that the firefighters who helped at the Fountains Fire would be receiving valor awards at the Monmouth County Annual Awards day, Sunday October 7, held at the Fireman's Park Eagle Hook and Ladder in Ocean Grove. The time is to be announced.

Sea Bright's annual Skim Board Bash had 85 registered participants. Skim Shop .com donated \$1,000. to the Recreation Department. Sea Bright residents Drew Mesick and Sean Stratton came in first and fourth respectively.

Councilwoman Bills said that they received letters from nearby towns, educators, and other groups supporting Sea Bright's plans for a Skateboard Park.

Monmouth County Health Commission has reported that canine rabies has disappeared from the United States. Dogs still can be affected by raccoons, skunks, or bats but they will not catch dog specific rabies from another canine.

F. Police/Education/Grants: Councilwoman Long reported that the speed limit was changed back to 40 MPH on Ocean Avenue ending the 35 MPH seasonal speed limit. Chief Moore and the Traffic Safety officer are compiling data assessing the effectiveness of the 35 MPH reduced speed limit. Possibly this data would allow for the 35 MPH lower speed limit all year round.

The Police department received 120 service calls in August. They continue to increase traffic safety enforcement with traffic safety points, radar details, pedestrian crosswalk details and child safety seat inspections.

Councilwoman Long thanked Detective Arias and Patrolman Fisler for running the Junior Police Academy. They received support from Recreation Director Morris and Special Officer Huegel. There were 45 Junior Police recruits for this summer program. There were day trips to the State Police Headquarters, New York and Keansburg's water park.

The Police, Fire and First Aid departments have been working together with the Code Blue program which was used four times during Labor Day weekend. The Code Blue program is for someone missing or in jeopardy.

Engineer Hoder is working on a Monmouth County Parks' grant application.

11. REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE: Joan Brearly of Sea Bright Village said that pet owner's should still keep inoculating their pets against rabies.

12. ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business before the Governing Body. Councilman Scriven made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:35 P.M. Second by Councilwoman Bills and approved upon unanimous voice vote.
