

MISSION

St. Bernard Project's mission is to ensure that disaster-impacted citizens and communities recover in a prompt, efficient, and predictable manner. Through its Disaster Recovery Lab, SBP works to share lessons learned, prevent common barriers to recovery, and help communities utilize its standardized, repeatable, and proven-effective model. Since its founding in 2006, SBP has rebuilt homes for nearly 700 families in New Orleans, LA and Joplin, MO with the help of over 70,000 volunteers. SBP is currently working on the ground in New York and New Jersey to help Hurricane Sandy survivors rebuild their homes and lives.

VERTICALLY INTEGRATED MODEL

The key to SBP's programmatic success is its model – SBP leverages AmeriCorps members, unskilled volunteer and in-house skilled labor to eliminate the need (and high costs) of subcontractors. This model enables SBP to rebuild homes far below market rate, and carry out construction projects with much lower subsidies than traditional affordable housing models.



REGIONAL REBUILDING PARTNERS

Through its work in New Orleans and later in Joplin, SBP has seen the need for post-disaster recovery to have a local face in order to represent community-specific values and respond to local needs. With this in mind, following Hurricane Sandy, SBP partnered with community-based organizations, **Friends of Rockaway** and **The Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation**, to transfer and activate its proven-effective model in Rockaway and Staten Island, NY. At the request of local leaders, SBP proudly partnered with **Sea Bright Rising** in March 2014 to expand its post-Sandy rebuilding work to serve Sea Bright, NJ and neighboring communities in Monmouth County.

POST-SANDY IMPACT: BY THE NUMBERS

STATEN ISLAND, NY:

350 Homes treated for mold
125 Homes received recovery services
45 Homes rebuilt!

ROCKAWAY, NY:

500 Homes received demolition & mold assessments
27 Homes received recovery services
38 Homes rebuilt!

SEA BRIGHT, NJ:

2/3 Of residents still displaced
200+ Families on the waiting list
30 Homes to be rebuilt in 2014!

Over a year after Hurricane Sandy, SBP still has **500+** families on our waiting lists.
