### COVID-19 Update #2 Borough of Sea Bright – 03/18/2020

We continue to monitor the situation surrounding COVID-19. To adhere to recent public health and government recommendations, **we have updated our continuity of operations plan which is effective immediately, March 18, 2020, and will remain in effect until further notice:**

- **Public access to Borough Hall, Library and Beach Pavilion has been suspended until further notice.**
- All Municipal Court Sessions are CANCELED through the end of March.
- Season beach badges are not available for purchase in Borough Hall but can be purchased through the VIPLY app on your mobile device.
- Borough staff will continue to conduct business via phone, email and fax. All payments, permit requests and documents requiring borough review/approval can be mailed to Borough Hall:

- The March 24, 2020 Planning Board meeting held at 7:30 PM will be held for the sole purpose of adopting pending resolutions. All other applications which were scheduled for that date are being carried to the April 14, 2020 Planning Board meeting without further notice. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the public **will not** be permitted into the meeting. Pursuant to DCA regulations and in compliance with the Open Public Meeting Act, the meeting will be broadcast via the Internet on the “Sea Bright Public Relations” Facebook page.
- We recommend residents exercise caution when visiting the beach and any public parks, and that they adhere to recommended social distancing guidelines.

- On March 16th, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No.104 to implement aggressive social distancing measures throughout the state.

- Enforcement of Executive Orders issued by the Governor.
- Supporting activities of partner agencies to serve the community while working to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
- Emergency acquisition of supplies and services and services to support our emergency response and recovery efforts.
