RESOLUTION NO. 81-2010 BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT RESOLUTION ADVOCATING OPERATING ASSISTANCE TO N.J. TRANSIT TO AVOID FARE INCREASES AND SERVICE REDUCTIONS

WHEREAS, New Jersey's extensive public transportation system operated by New Jersey Transit is among the state's most important economic assets, and investing in must be a high priority; and

WHEREAS, NJ Transit has proposed a 25 percent fare increase on all public transportation across the state, together with service cuts, in order to fill the agency's budget gap for 2010-11; and

WHEREAS, under NJ Transit's proposal, a one-way rail fare from Middletown to New York Penn Station would rise from \$11.50 to \$14.25, an off-peak round-trip from \$19.75 to \$28.50, and a monthly pass from \$326 to \$408; and approximately 1,000 commuters would be adversely affected by the elimination of certain train runs, including four trains on the North Jersey Coast Line; and

WHEREAS, NJ Transit proposes to discontinue service on Bus Route 833 serving the Red Bank rail station, Brookdale College, Colts Neck at State Highway 34 and County Route 537, Freehold Centre, the Monmouth County Court House, and the Freehold Raceway Mall; and NJ Transit also proposes discontinuation of service on Bus Route 835 serving the Red Bank rail station, Fair Haven, Rumson and Sea Bright; and

WHEREAS, fare increases and service cuts are counterproductive, resulting in loss of ridership and revenue and diversion of riders to single-occupant vehicles that will cause increased traffic congestion on already crowded Monmouth County roadways; and

WHEREAS, the proposed fare increases and service cuts will be devastating to individuals with low income, job seekers, senior citizens, the disabled and students-many of whom do not have automobiles or cannot drive and will therefore be denied access to employment, medical treatment, jury service, court proceedings, school, and food shopping; and

WHEREAS, the diversion of rail and bus passengers to automobiles will aggravate critical county, state and national problems, including air pollution and overreliance on imported oil; and

WHEREAS, affordable public transportation is critical for economic development and competitiveness, generating an enormous return on investment in terms of growth in employment, income, tax revenues as well as reduction in such costs as time lost in vehicular traffic congestion and vehicle maintenance;
