ORDINANCE No. 29-2010 ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, AMENDING CHAPTER 198, VEHICLES, ABANDONED OF THE CODE OF SEA BRIGHT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, and State of New Jersey, that certain sections of Chapter 198 of the Code of Sea Bright are amended as follows and the rest of the chapter remain unchanged:

SECTION: 198-3. Removal of abandoned vehicles

Whenever any member of the Borough Police Department finds any motor vehicle abandoned on any public streets or public highway or public property, he shall take possession thereof by removing or securing its removal to such place as may be designated by the Chief of Police. Such taking of possession shall be reported immediately to the Director of the Motor Vehicle Commission on a form prescribed by the Director for verification of ownership.

SECTION: 198-5. Junk title certificate; fee

If the Borough Police Department shall, in its report thereof to the Director of the Motor Vehicle Commission certify on an application prescribed by the Director that such motor vehicle is incapable of being operated safely or of being put in safe operational condition, except at a cost in excess of the value thereof, the Motor Vehicle Commission shall, without further certification or verification issue to the borough for a fee as charged by the Motor Vehicle Commission a junk title certificate thereto, with proper assignment thereon, which shall be assigned and delivered to the purchaser of the vehicle at public sale.

SECTION: 198-6. Application for certificate of ownership; fee Upon the sale of any motor vehicle for which no junk certificate shall have been issued, the borough shall execute and deliver to Sea Bright, New Jersey Council Meeting Minutes December 7, 2010 Page Three

the purchaser an application for certificate of ownership prescribed by the Director of the Motor Vehicle Commission, in the same form and manner as provided in N.J.S.A. 39:10-15, which shall also contain the name and address, if known, of the former owner. Such application shall be accepted by the Director of the Motor Vehicle Commission for issuance of a certificate of ownership for a fee as charged by the Motor Vehicle Commission.

SECTION: 198-7. Violations and penalties

Penalties for violations of this ordinance shall be as provide in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article I, unless otherwise specified in this chapter.

ORDINANCE No. 30-2010 ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, AMENDING CHAPTER 195, TOWING OF THE CODE OF SEA BRIGHT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, and State of New Jersey, that certain sections of Chapter 195 of the Code of Sea Bright are amended as follows and the rest of the Chapter remains unchanged:

SECTION: 195-1. Definitions

POLICE OFFICER - Any regular police officer, Class I or class II Special Police Officer and any State Police Officer and/or the Code Enforcement Officer or their designee.

SECTION: 195-8. Insurance policies.

A. Garage keeper's **legal liability** policy; a garage keeper's **legal** liability policy covering vehicles while stored against loss by fire or other casualty in the minimum amount of \$50,000.

SECTION: 195-10. Inspections; correction of violations.

B. If the Chief of Police determines that the terms of this chapter are being violated by a permittee or if he or she receives notice from the Code Enforcement Officer that a permittee is storing towed vehicles at an unauthorized location, he or she may order immediate correction of any noncompliance, specifying a reasonable period within which such corrections are to be made, failing which he or she may revoke or suspend permits.

SECTION: 195-13. Payment of charges; rates.

- (1). For towing any passenger automobiles, a maximum fee of \$100 may be charged.
- (2). For every day of dead outdoor storage, \$20 per day may be charged for passenger automobiles, trucks and omnibuses and \$30.00 per day may be charged for tractor-trailers.
- (3). Waiting time and/or winching time for wreckers may be charged at a flat rate fee of \$25 per ½ hour. Waiting time charged shall not begin until at least ½ hour after the time of arrival of the tow truck/wrecker at the scene.
- (4). If a heavy-duty wrecker is required for towing, the charge shall be \$150 per vehicle, plus \$2 per mile for towing to the authorized storage facility. If a heavy-duty wrecker must be used for removal of vehicles from accidents, the maximum charge may be \$200.
- (5). If an operator is called out to tow or remove from an accident and there is debris from the accident, such as broken glass, removed bumpers or panels or the like, the operator, upon satisfactory debris cleanup, can charge to the vehicle owner a flat fee of \$30 for cleanup services.
- C. Operators are permitted to petition the Borough Council, in writing, as to prevailing rates.

SECTION: 195-16. Permit fees.

Each application for a permit shall be accompanied by a fee of \$200 per business and a registration fee of \$50 per vehicle for the year. If said application is rejected ½ of the application fee and all of the vehicle registration fees shall be refunded by submitting a properly executed voucher.

SECTION: 195-17. Disposal of abandoned vehicles.

If, at the end of 30 days, the registered owner of the motor vehicle has not claimed his/her vehicle, then the operator shall be permitted to request that the chief of Police or his/her agent shall submit the appropriate application for a salvage permit for the vehicle. This provision applies only to motor vehicles directed to be towed by the Police Department.
