### 7. COUNCIL PRESIDENT WILLIAM J. KEELER - 2010 ADDRESS

President Keeler said Sea Bright operates under the weak Mayor form of government with six Councilmembers. The Mayor only votes when there is a tie vote.

Sea Bright's Governing Body has six committees. Councilwoman Long chairs the Beach, Education, and Environment Committees. Councilman LoBiondo chairs the Public Works, Building Department, and Public Relations Committees. Councilman Keeler said that he chairs the Public Safety and Insurance Committees. Councilman Murphy heads the Finance, Grants, and Court Committees. Councilwoman Bills chairs the Personnel, Administration, Cultural Arts, and Recreation Committees. Councilman Kelly heads the Smart Growth, Flood Mitigation, and Beautification Committees.

Council President Keeler thanked Borough Administrator/Clerk Smeltzer and her staff for their professionalism. He said that he appreciated all the members of the Police, Public Works, Courts and the Library for their work. He thanked all the many people who served as volunteers on the Committees and his opportunity to serve Sea Bright's residents.

#### 8. MAYOR MARIA D. FERNANDES - 2011 NEW YEAR MESSAGE:

On behalf of Mayor Maria D. Fernandes, Administrator/Clerk Smeltzer read into the record her 2011 New Year's Message.

Good Morning and welcome Lt. Gov. Kim Guadagno, Assemblywoman Angelini, Freeholder Curley, Sea Bright taxpayers, voters, Council Members, Father Manning of Holy Cross Church, and Sea Bright United Methodist Church Layman George Finegan. It is an honor to have you present at our Reorganization Meeting.

I would like to extend my congratulations to Councilwoman Peggy Bills and Councilman Brian Kelly on their successful re-election for 2011. I look forward to working with them as well as all members of the Sea Bright Council.

I would also like to extend my sincere appreciation and thanks to all members of Council, Planning Board, employees and volunteers, of the borough. They are hard working and I truly appreciate them. I am looking forward to continuing the excellent working relationship we have had.

I am sorry I can't be here in person today, but I want everyone to know that I have attended a number of council meetings this past year via telephone. I have also been busy attending to borough business from my hospital bed at Monmouth Medical Center where I am today. Please be assured that I am of sound mind and my work as Mayor of the Borough has not suffered as a result of my current health condition.

I wanted to make everyone aware of my current health condition. This week I had to have a leg amputation below my left knee but the doctors expect me to fully recover. I was advised that I will be transferred to a rehabilitation facility on Monday. Be advised that I am under excellent care and I am feeling well.

As for the State of the Council, first I do not want any Council Members to take what I have to say in any other fashion except that it is intended as constructive criticism and not a personal attack.

The points I want to raise are as follows:

- Last year Council President Keeler, in his Reorganization Address to the Borough stated that Sea Bright operates under a weak Mayor form of Government. This is factual, but I can assure everyone that I have consistently been a-hands on Mayor. As a result, throughout 2010 I have tried to communicate through the Council President via telephone about borough matters. Unfortunately, this did not play out too well.
- The Borough Code defines some of the Council President's duties are to include holding all powers and duties in accordance with the law; keeping the Mayor fully informed on all issues to ensure adequate communication with the entire governing body. However, as Mayor, I am the Chief Executive Officer and head of the Municipal Government. As such, this year it is my intention to take over the direction of the Borough Council. Also, since the Borough has an appointed Administrator, the executive responsibilities of the day-to-day operations of the Borough should be done by the Administrator.
- As per the Borough Code which was adopted by the Sea Bright Governing Body, "the Governing Body shall accomplish the work of the government through Standing Council Committees. As you will see from today's agenda, there are listed six Council Committees. These committees are established in order to ensure

effective government. I call upon each Council Member here today to adhere to this policy, have regular committee meetings and officially report at the second regular monthly meeting of the Council on recent committee activities. I also ask each and every one of you to keep me and the Borough Administrator fully informed on all issues being addressed by each committee.

• On January 5, 2011 I e-mailed the entire Council concerning the skyrocketing legal and engineering expenses. I asked each one of them to respond to me about their thoughts by January 7<sup>th</sup>. The only two who responded were Councilwoman Long and Councilman Kelly who I would like to thank for their responsiveness, concerns and ideas for future savings.

As the Chief Executive Officer, the Mayor has the power to issue executive orders. Executive Orders are something most people do not understand. They encompass a wide range of topics and can be anything from giving direction to a governing unit or addressing events. These orders are tools to help the Council manage the government departments under their jurisdiction i.e. Council Committees.

As a result of the lack of communication between the Borough Council and myself in keeping me fully informed on all issues as it relates to the entire governing body I am issuing the following Executive orders:

- Executive Order No. 1-2011 requiring the Council President to provide an e-mail address and cell phone number for adequate borough communication.
- Executive Order No. 2-2011 requiring all council members, except Councilwoman Long and Councilman Kelly who have already responded, to respond to my e-mail of January 5, 2011 concerning their input on the 2011 professional appointments and the financial questions raised previously by me which remain unanswered.
- Executive Order No. 3-2011 to postpone the following appointments for the reasons given: the Borough Attorney whose legal bills amounted to over \$150,000 in 2010 up from \$89,000 in 2009; the Borough Auditor because another Auditor's 2011 RFP proposal came in \$2,000 lower; the Labor Attorney who I have not had the courtesy of receiving an official call about. I have serious questions that have not been answered by our Council Members. There is no need to appoint all the professionals today until a complete review of the matters I have brought up are addressed. These professional appointments can be held over for 30 days.

On another note, I would like Lt. Governor Kim Guadagno to tell Governor Christie how pleased I am with the job he is trying to do. I have also always respected Lt. Governor Gaudagno and the frugal way in which she operated Monmouth Beach as a Commissioner.

I would also like to let everyone know that on Sunday, January  $9^{\rm th}$  at noon the Ancient Order of Hibernians, Division 2 will be holding their annual polar plunge. Bishop O'Connell of the Arch

Diocese of Trenton will be here in Sea Bright taking the plunge. I hope everyone will be able to attend.

In closing, let me be very clear to you the taxpayers and voters of Sea Bright, I will get better and you will see me as soon as I recover. I will be back and I will run for Mayor in 2012.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 has been amended to permit the fixing of said rate of 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 and allows an additional penalty of 6% be collected against a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 on properties that fail to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Tax/Sewer Collector is hereby authorized and directed to charge 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of taxes, sewer and other municipal charges becoming delinquent after the due date and 18% per annum on any amount of taxes, sewer and other municipal charges in excess of \$1,500.00 becoming delinquent after the due date and if a delinquency is in excess of \$10,000.00 and remains in arrears beyond December  $31^{\rm st}$ , an additional penalty of 6% shall be charged against the delinquency.
