A. Fire/Finance Administration:

Councilman Keeler reported that he and several members of the SBFD visited the KDE plant to inspect the manufacturing of the fire truck, which should arrive in several weeks.

Councilman Keeler said that the 2012 budget workshop meeting is scheduled for March $\mathbf{5}^{\text{th}}.$

B. Capital Improvements & Facilities Master Plan:

She proposed a committee to attend the meetings to keep the governing body informed of this issue. Councilman Leckstein volunteered to attend the bridge meetings.

11. COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE (limited to 3 minutes per person) Maryann McKenzie said that Oceanport, Monmouth Beach, West Long Branch and Shore Regional have moved their school elections to November.

Frieda Finegan of Beach Street said the kids need to play at the basketball court but are hindered because of the parked cars.
