Mayor Long called the meeting to order and requested those present to join her in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Long read the following statement:

Good Evening Ladies And Gentlemen. This Meeting Is Now Called To Order. In Line With The Borough Of Sea Bright's Longstanding Policy Of Open Government, And In Compliance With The "Open Public Meetings Act" I Wish To Advise You That Adequate Notice Of This Regularly Scheduled Meeting Has Been Advertised In The Asbury Park Press On January 20, 2012 And Posted On The Bulletin Board In The Borough Office. In Each Instance, The Date, Time And Location Of This Meeting Were Provided In The Notice. This Meeting Is Open To The Public."

PROCLAMATIONS:

A. NATIONAL MOMENT OF REMEMBRANCE SEPT. 11th.

WHEREAS, the Governing body of THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT expresses their support of the United State's Senate regarding coming together as a Nation and ceasing all work or other activity for a moment of remembrance beginning at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time on September 11, 2012, in honor of the 11th anniversary of the terrorist attacks committed against the United States on September 11, 2001; and

WHEREAS, at 8:46 a.m., on September 11, 2001, hijacked American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the upper portion of the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, New York; and

WHEREAS, 17 minutes later, at 9:03 a.m., hijacked United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center; and

WHEREAS, at 9:37 a.m., the west wall of the Pentagon was hit by hijacked American Airlines Flight 77, the impact of which caused immediate and catastrophic damage to the headquarters of the Department of Defense; and

WHEREAS, at approximately 10:00 a.m., the passengers and crew of hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 acted heroically to retake control of the airplane and thwart the taking of additional American lives by crashing the airliner in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and, in doing so, gave their lives to save countless others; and

WHEREAS, nearly 3,000 innocent civilians were killed in the heinous attacks of September 11, 2001; and

WHEREAS, tens of thousands of individuals narrowly escaped the attacks at the Pentagon and World Trade Center and, as witnesses to this tragedy, are forever changed; and WHEREAS, countless fire departments, police departments, first responders, governmental officials, workers, emergency medical personnel, and volunteers responded immediately and heroically to those horrific events; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Department of New York suffered 343 fatalities on September 11, 2001, the largest loss of life of any emergency response agency in United States history; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority Police Department suffered 37 fatalities in the attacks, the largest loss of life of any police force in United States history in a single day; and

WHEREAS, the New York Police Department suffered 23 fatalities as a result of the terrorist attacks; and

WHEREAS, the impact of that day on public health continues through 2011, as nearly 90,000 people are at risk of or suffering from negative health effects as a result of the events of September 11, 2001, including 14,000 workers and 2,400 community residents who are sick, and tens of thousands of others whose health is being monitored; and

WHEREAS, 10 years later, the people of the United States and people around the world continue to mourn the tremendous loss of innocent life on that fateful day; and

WHEREAS, 11 years later, thousands of men and women in the United States Armed Forces remain in harm's way defending the United States against those who seek to threaten the United States; and

WHEREAS, on the 11th anniversary of this tragic day, the thoughts of the people of the United States are with all of the victims of the events of September 11, 2001 and their families; and

WHEREAS, the lives of Americans were changed forever on September 11, 2001, when events threatened the American way of life; and

WHEREAS, in 2009, Congress and the President joined together to designate September 11 as a National Day of Service and Remembrance under the Serve America Act (Public Law 111-13; 123 Stat. 1460); and

WHEREAS, in September 2009 and 2010, President Obama issued Proclamation 8413 (74 Fed. Reg. 47045) and Proclamation 8559 (75 Fed. Reg. 56463) proclaiming September 11, 2009, and September 11, 2010, respectively, as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance; and

WHEREAS, September 11 will never, and should never, be just another day in the hearts and minds of all people of the United States;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT.

(1) recognizes September 11, 2012, as a day of solemn commemoration of the events of September 11, 2001, and a day to come together as a Nation; and

- (2) offers its deepest and most sincere condolences to the families, friends, and loved ones of the innocent victims of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks; and
- (3) honors the heroic service, actions, and sacrifices of first responders, law enforcement personnel, State and local officials, volunteers, and countless others who aided the innocent victims of those attacks and, in doing so, bravely risked and often gave their own lives; and
- (4) recognizes the valiant service, actions, and sacrifices of United States personnel, including members of the United States Armed Forces, the United States intelligence agencies, the United States diplomatic service, homeland security and law enforcement personnel, and their families, who have given so much, including their lives and well-being, to support the cause of freedom and defend the security of the United States; and
- (5) reaffirms that the people of the United States will never forget the challenges our country endured on and since September 11, 2001, and will work tirelessly to defeat those who attacked the United States; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on the 11th anniversary of this tragic day in United States history the governing body of the BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT calls upon all of the people and institutions of the United States to observe a moment of remembrance on September 11, 2012, including (i) media outlets; (ii) houses of worship; (iii) military organizations; (iv) veterans organizations; (v) airlines; (vi) airports; (vii) railroads; (viii) sports teams; (ix) the Federal Government; (x) State and local governments; (xi) police, fire, and other public institutions; (xii) educational institutions; (xiii) businesses; and (xiv) other public and private institutions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governing body of THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT encourages the observance of the moment of remembrance to last for 1 minute beginning at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time by, to the maximum extent practicable ceasing all work or other activity; and marking the moment in an appropriate manner, including by ringing bells, blowing whistles, or sounding sirens.

B. PROCLAMATION IN HONOR OF NATIONAL FERAL CAT DAY

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright has a rich diversity of wild life, including a population of feral and stray cats; and

WHEREAS, Tuesday, October 16, 2012, is "National Feral Cat Day," a day dedicated to educating communities about feral cats and Trap-Neuter-Return, a humane method of care for outdoor cats; and

WHEREAS, Trap-Neuter-Return is a program that improves the lives of cats and stabilizes cat populations. Cats that live outdoors are humanely trapped and brought to a veterinarian to be evaluated, spayed or neutered, and vaccinated; and

WHEREAS, Trap-Neuter-Return is recognized throughout the United States and other countries as the humane and responsible way to care for feral cats;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dina Long, Mayor of the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, October 16, 2012, as

"NATIONAL FERAL CAT DAY" in Sea Bright and urge all citizens to support Trap-Neuter-Return as a responsible and humane method of care for feral cat populations.

WHEREAS, these volunteers have helped to find forever homes for countless kittens born in the Borough of Sea Bright; and

WHEREAS, the volunteers have partnered with the Monmouth County SPCA and the Borough of Sea Bright to run a successful Trap-Neuter-Release program for the humane management of Sea Bright's stray and feral cats; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of Sea Bright, New Jersey wish to honor and recognize the work of:

ORDINANCE NO. 11-2012

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER 130, LAND USE,
ARTICLE I, TITLE; PURPOSES; REQUIREMENTS,
SECTION 130-3 REQUIREMENTS PARAGRAPH B
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that Chapter 130, Article I, Title; Purposes; Requirements Section 130-3 Requirements, Paragraph B shall be amended as follows:

Section 130-3 Paragraph B shall be revised, in its entirety, as follows:

- (1) Unless proposed improvements are defined as an "exempt development", site plan and/or subdivision approval is required for applications involving (a) the subdivision of land, (b) site development, (c) construction, (d) any change of use, building, structure or site from any class of zoning use set forth in this chapter to any other class of zoning use, (e) any conditional use applications or (f) the construction or alteration of any off-street parking area.
- (2) "Exempt development" shall be defined as follows:
- a) Construction, additions or alterations related to single-family or two-family detached dwellings on individual lots
- b) Interior alterations which do not increase the required number of off-street parking $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right) +\left($
- c) Construction or installation of underground facilities which do not alter the general use, appearance or grade of the site.
- d) In the B-1 Central Business Zone only, the construction, alteration of, or addition to any premises which creates no variances other than the need for an increase of five
 - (5) or less vehicle parking spaces. This shall be a one-

time exemption stemming from the parking requirement in effect for the premises as of the date of the passage of this ordinance or as set forth at the time of a previous site plan approval. Additionally, if the one-time exemption is deemed to apply, the applicant shall not be required to obtain parking variance relief.

- e) Divisions of property, and conveyances so as to combine existing lots, which are not considered to be subdivisions in accordance with the definition of Subdivision contained within this Article.
- f) Individual applications for accessory mechanical equipment, accessory storage structures and accessory structures and uses not exceeding five hundred (500) square feet in area, whose operation and location conforms to the design and performance standards of this Chapter and whose installation is on a site already occupied by an active principal use for which site plan approval is not otherwise required.
- (3) If a development defined as an "exempt development" within the ordinance requires approval from the Zoning Board of Adjustment, the applicant is required to file an application with the Zoning Board of Adjustment, and must appear before the Board.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED all other sections of Chapter 130 shall remain in full force and effect. In the event there is any conflict or inconsistency between this particular ordinance and the rest of Chapter 130, the terms in this ordinance shall prevail.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption, passage and publication according to law and moved the Public Hearing to be held.

WHEREAS, a proposal was submitted by the firm of T&M Engineering the Borough Engineer of record for submission of a grant application to Monmouth County Open Space, and

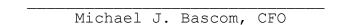
WHEREAS, said grant application is for the construction of a playground on the beach, and
