# ALLOWING FOR INTERIM OCCUPANCY ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY DURING THE ELEVATION OF HOMES

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution: seconded by Councilmember Keeler

**WHEREAS,** as a result of Super Storm Sandy, many residents are required or desire to elevate their homes above the mandatory base flood elevations; and

WHEREAS, during the elevating process the home cannot be occupied; and

**WHEREAS**, it is recognized by the Borough Council that the difficulty presented to its residents is one of extraordinary circumstances requiring similar relief.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** Sea Bright residents who require alternative housing as a result of elevating their homes are hereby exempt from the Municipal Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, to allow for a residential trailer to be placed on said property for the purposes of temporary housing, only during the period of time necessary to elevate their home in accordance with the following:

- 1. No trailer may be placed on said property until such time as all required permitting for the elevation of the house has been secured by the property owner. This includes making proper provision for utility services, including, but not limited to wastewater, solid waste and recycling disposal.
- 2. The trailer must be placed within the boundaries of said property and no closer than 2 feet to the property lines.
- 3. Occupancy of said trailer will be for a period of not more than 90 calendar days; said occupancy can be extended for a period not to exceed an additional 90 days upon application to the zoning officer. No further extensions shall be permitted.
- 4. A Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued for said property until such time as the trailer is removed.
- 5. Under no circumstances shall a residence be re-occupied until the Borough issues a Certificate of Occupancy.
  - 6. No trailers shall be placed on any public street in the Borough.

- 4. A Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued for said property until such time as the temporary trailer is removed.
- 5. Under no circumstances shall the business be re-occupied until the Borough issues a Certificate of Occupancy.
- 6. The Sea Bright Police Department is hereby directed to convert the portion Of Wayne Street running perpendicular to the subject property from a one way to a two-way street. This portion of Wayne Street shall remain open for local traffic. Said conversion shall cease upon the removal of the temporary trailer.

#### **ORDINANCE NO.12-2013**

# AUTHORIZING THE USE OF COMMERCIAL TRAILERS IN THE B-3 ZONE DURING RECONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to  $\underline{\text{N.J.S.A.}}$  40:48-2.3, the Borough of Sea Bright has the inherent police power to address and rectify the condition of damaged or destroyed commercial buildings in the Borough so as to provide for the public health, safety and general welfare of its citizens, and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Land Use Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-1 et.seq., the Borough may from time to time amend its land use ordinances to deal with certain exigent circumstances to facilitate the rebuilding of damaged and/or destroyed commercial structures with the Borough, and

**WHEREAS** the Borough Council deems it necessary, as part of the ongoing reconstruction efforts throughout the Borough, to allow certain businesses to conduct interim operations out of a commercial trailer until such time as the business establishment has been reconstructed and can be occupied, and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough Council finds that there is an overriding public purpose in the creation of such a use for certain commercial establishments during the rebuilding and/or reconstruction of their business establishments, and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to  $\underline{\text{N.J.S.A.}}$  40:48-2, a municipality may make such ordinances as it deems necessary and proper for the good government, order and protection of persons and property, and the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

#### **SECTION ONE:**

The Borough of Sea Bright hereby amends the list of permitted uses in the B-3 zone to include the following:

- 1. Commercial trailers shall be a permitted conditional use, subject to the following:
  - (a) There shall only be a maximum of one commercial trailer per business establishment, and only commercial activities directly related to the business establishment on that particular property that is being rebuilt or reconstructed shall be allowed to be conducted from the trailer.
  - (b) There shall be no sub-leasing of any such trailers whatsoever; any violation of this provision shall result in an enforcement action to require the immediate shutdown and removal of such a trailer from the subject premises.
  - (c) No commercial trailer shall be occupied unless it is code compliant and all requisite utility services are provided as per applicable codes and regulations; it shall be within the purview of the zoning officer and construction official to approve the proposed location of the trailer. No trailer shall be located within twenty-five (25) feet of a public right of way, and shall be at least twenty-five (25) feet back from any adjacent property. It is within the discretion of the zoning office to advise an applicant that site plan approval may be required. If a denial letter is issued by the zoning officer this decision may be appealed by the applicant as provided for under the Municipal Land Use Law.
  - (d) The occupancy of the trailer is limited to one year from date of issuance of the appropriate permit or approval. No renewal of the permit shall be permitted.
  - (e) The occupancy of the trailer must be terminated and the trailer must be removed from the premises no later than ten (10) calendar days of the issuance of a temporary or permanent certificate of occupancy for the subject premises.

#### **SECTION TWO:**

The Borough of Sea Bright hereby authorizes the Business Administrator and Zoning Officer to develop an application process to insure that the installation of any commercial trailer is done in accordance with all applicable codes and sub-codes. In addition, the property owner must cooperate with the code officials of the Borough for inspection of said work to insure that it is done in accordance with applicable codes. All work that has to be performed must be with the necessary permits and inspections required by the Borough and/or the State of New Jersey.

#### **SECTION THREE:**

All ordinances, codes and parts of same inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby replaced to the extent of such inconsistency.

#### **SECTION FOUR:**

If any section, paragraph provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, paragraphs or provisions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

#### **SECTION FIVE:**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as required by law.
