## MINUTES REGULAR MEETING BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

A Regular Meeting of the Borough Council was held in the Cecil F. Norton Community Center, 1167 Ocean Avenue, Sea Bright, NJ 07760 at 7:30 p.m. Mayor Long called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. and requested those present join her in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

#### **OPENING STATEMENT**

Mayor Long read the following statement:

Good Evening Ladies and Gentlemen. This Meeting Is Now Called To Order. In Line With The Borough Of Sea Bright's Longstanding Policy Of Open Government, And In Compliance With The "Open Public Meetings Act" I Wish To Advise You That Adequate Notice Of This Regularly Scheduled Meeting Has Been Advertised In The Asbury Park Press On January 11, 2013 And Posted On The Bulletin Board In The Borough Office. In Each Instance, The Date, Time, And Location Of This Meeting Were Provided In The Notice. This Meeting Is Open To The Public.

#### **REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE:** (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

- 1. Elizabeth DeGiulio, 1540 Ocean Avenue, expressed thanks to everyone who helped to get the lights back on and have public access.
- 2. Joanne R. St. Amand, of Yacht Harbor Condominiums, 1382 Ocean Avenue, came to ask for support from the governing body. Ms. St. Amand explained that she has a profoundly intellectually disabled sister who resides at the Woodbridge Developmental Center. The group to which she belongs, the WDC Parents Association, is asking Governor Christie to keep the Woodbridge Developmental Center and North Jersey Developmental Center open for the good of the residents and their families. She is requesting a resolution from the Sea Bright governing body in support of this issue. Ms. St. Amand described the stress and hardships that will be realized by the residents of these facilities and by their families if these centers are closed. Woodbridge and Totowa are the closest of the seven centers in New Jersey. If these two centers are closed, the residents would have to move to centers that are over one hundred miles away. Informational materials will be provided to Council, including a sample resolution.
- 3. Brian George, of North Shore, the clothing store, described a proposed "Celebrate Sea Bright" free concert that he has agreed to produce. It would take place on Labor Day weekend, Sunday, September 1, 2013, at 6:00 p.m. The concert, featuring "The B Street Band", would last two hours, take place on the public beach, and be of no cost to the borough. Sponsors would bear the cost. There would be no alcohol served. The Police Chief has signed off on it. Mr. George came to the meeting to get a consensus from the Mayor and Council about approving the concert. Mayor Long stated that someone will get

back to Mr. George by Friday. Councilmember Keeler asked about making sure there is insurance for the event.

- 4. David De Sio, 822 Ocean Avenue, made a statement in objection to Res. No. 136-2013, which supports the acquisition of 960 Ocean Avenue through the state's Blue Acres Program.
- 5. Michael Chimento, 934 Ocean Avenue, made a statement in opposition to Res. No. 136-2013.
- 6. Susana Markson, 1187 Ocean Avenue, made a statement in support of Res. No. 136-2013.
- 7. Barry Barbella, 932 Ocean Avenue, made a statement in opposition to Res. No. 136-2013.
- 8. Mike Walsh, 2 East New Street, asked about the status of the sea wall and what plans are being discussed to provide storm protection. Mr. Verruni stated that FEMA has submitted a project worksheet and is looking at ideas for mitigation. Mayor Long stated that the plan will probably be to put the sea wall back to the way it was.
- 9. Murphy Anderson, 8 Center Street, asked whether there is a plan to widen the road. He also stated that a traffic signs are needed. Mr. Verruni answered that signs are on the way.
- 10. Butch Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, asked whether FEMA looked at the sea wall on East Church Street, and was answered in the affirmative.
- 11. Beatrix Patton, 924 Ocean Avenue, asked who decides what the Anchorage Apartment property will become. Mayor Long answered that the governing body will make recommendations. Mr. Verruni explained that Green Acres funding is for open space.
- 12. Mr. Cashumar, 902 Ocean Avenue, made a statement in opposition to Res. No. 136-2013.

No. 134 - 2013 Authorizing Sewerage Rates and Charges for Second, Third, and Fourth Quarter of 2013 and First Quarter of 2014

**RESOLUTION NO. 134 - 2013 AUTHORIZING SEWERAGE RATES AND CHARGES FOR SECOND, THIRD, AND FOURTH QUARTER OF 2013 AND FIRST QUARTER OF 2014** 

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Keeler.

**WHEREAS,** the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright authorized the rates and charges of the municipal public utility for sewerage for the second, third and fourth quarter of 2013 and the first quarter of 2014.

**WHEREAS,** any previous schedule of charges adopted by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright which are inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded.

WHEREAS, the rates and charges for the utilities are as follows:

- 1. The 2013 second, third and fourth and 2014 first quarter sewerage rate will be at the rate of \$9.90 for every 1,000 gallons of water consumed by the customer.
- 2. The charges shall be due and payable in 2013 and 2014 within 10 days after the due date of the municipal sewer utilities bill. If the bill is not timely paid, the outstanding bill shall be considered a municipal charge and shall be subject to the same rate of interest accruing on delinquent taxes. The second quarter billing in 2013 shall be mailed during July of 2013 which will be for consumption billed by the water company from mid March thru mid June. The third quarter billing in 2013 shall be mailed in October for consumption billed by the water company from mid June thru mid September. The fourth quarter 2013 billing shall be mailed in January 2014 for consumption billed by the water company from mid September thru mid December. The first quarter billing in 2014 shall be mailed during April 2014 for consumption billed by the water company from mid December 2013 thru mid March 2014.
- 3. Consumption shall be based upon the information provided to the Borough of Sea Bright Municipal Sewer Utility by the New Jersey American Water Company. The customers that are billed by the New Jersey American Water Company on a quarterly basis shall have their sewer charge based upon the quarterly water charges from New Jersey American Water Company. Those customers that are billed on a monthly basis by New Jersey American Water Company shall have their bills based upon their water consumption.
  - 4. All customers of the municipal sewer utility shall be billed for at least 10,000 gallons quarterly. This minimum charge shall be \$99.00 for the second, third and fourth quarters of 2013 and the first quarter of 2014.
  - 5. The consumption charges shall be billed to the metered townhouse or condominium association or corporation for payment.
- 6. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Charges shall be adjudged unconstitutional or to be ineffective in whole or in part, to the extent that it is not adjudged unconstitutional or is not effective, it shall be valid and effective; and no other section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Charges shall on account thereof be deemed invalid or ineffective and the inapplicability or invalidity of any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Rates and Charges in any one or more instances or under any one or more circumstances shall not be taken to affect or prejudice in any way its applicability or validity in any other instances or under other circumstances.
- 7. A copy of same shall at all times be kept on file at the office of the Tax/Sewer Utility Collector at 1167 Ocean Avenue, Sea Bright, New Jersey and shall at all reasonable times be open to public inspection.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that the utility is hereby authorized to publish a notice of final adoption of said Resolution of Rates and Charges.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that they hereby authorize the utility to forward a copy of said Resolution of Rates and Charges to the customers of the utility at the utility's discretion.
