REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Janet Hentschel, 7 E. Church Street, addressed the abandoned properties and why the Borough is not involved in the DCA program which provides demolition financial assistance for abandoned properties. Mayor Long responded that we are aware of the program but we are not participating at this time. Also commented on the lack of progress in the Peninsula parking lot which is hurting the business community. Borough Administrator Verruni reported on the progress and stated we have been assured by the contractor that all work would be completed by the end of the week. Ms. Hentschel also expressed concern about the walkway along the side of the police station as it is full of potholes. Council agreed that it would be repaired. Finally, Ms. Hentschel thanked Mr. Verruni for getting the temporary customer parking signs.

Linda Richter, 2 Village Road, offered support for the Department of Public Works as they cannot feel good about what they do. We should come up with a plan on how they can improve our town because there is so much work that hasn't been done. Councilman Murphy offered to meet with Ms. Richter this week to discuss.

Mark Pappas, Sunrise Condominiums, thanked the Council for supporting the Sea Bright website. Thanked all for the great showing at the Benjamin Moore Main St. Matters event. Asked if the Borough was going to post slower speed limit signs. Councilman Murphy responded that the signs have been posted.

Jean Kingman, 36 Waterview Way, inquired about widening Ocean Avenue in front of the Anchorage apartment building when it is demolished to allow for a longer turn lane heading over the Rumson bridge. Remarked that after being away all winter, she is very underwhelmed with the progress in the Borough.

Habitat for Humanity is building a house on the corner of Marius Lane and Ocean Avenue. Sea Bright Rising has four homes underway and the first family scheduled to move back home will be in the third week of June.

Mayor Long gave an update on the Borough's progress since Super Storm Sandy and how we stand as the beach season is upon us.

Ruth Fialko, 150 Ocean Avenue, asked if the dune fencing was going to continue into north beach. There is a lot of foot traffic through the dunes in the north end. Councilman Murphy responded that fencing will eventually be up to the bridge and signs are on order.

Jean Kingman, 36 Waterview Way, thanked Linda Richter for all the work she is done. Asked when the back-in parking will be in place. Borough Administrator reported that we are waiting for the signs to come in. Inquired about the number of police cars the Borough owns.
