WHEREAS, the dedicated \$25 million annual allocation for the New Jersey Shore Protection Fund has supported a unique and successful cost-sharing partnership with the federal government in replenishing eroded beaches along the 137 mile Jersey coast from Middlesex to Cape May County and provides needed matching funds for the NJ DEP's numerous other municipal coastal projects; and

WHEREAS, Superstorm Sandy demonstrated the value of well-nourished wide beaches with dune systems in protecting life and property along the coast and preventing more extensive damage to critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, healthy beaches, coastal ocean front, and bayside shorelines fuel our State's economy, bringing in \$19 billion in tourism revenue annually - one half of the State's total

\$38 billion tourism revenue. People invest in the Jersey Shore because we have recreational and protective beaches and waterfronts; and

WHEREAS, we must be proactive, not reactive, in preparing for the likely onset of more frequent Sandy-like storms in light of sea level rise, climate change and increasing development along the coast; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey, working with the Army Corps of Engineers, must develop a more comprehensive plan that includes inland waterways that increasingly flood coastal and urban communities, including the back bays and barrier islands; and

WHEREAS, the \$25 million allocated from the Shore Protection Fund will not be enough to meet current and anticipated future matching costs of Corps of Engineers and State replenishment projects and other needed coastal protection projects by the numerous coastal municipalities in New Jersey. Further, the 2015 proposed federal budget for beach replenishment projects is the lowest it has been in the past decade; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth as follows:

The New Jersey Legislature is urged to increase funding for the dedicated \$25 million New Jersey Shore Protection Fund to be used for future coastal protection projects and provide a further incentive for federal matching funds; and

ORDINANCE # 12-2014

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 130 "LAND USE", ARTICLE IX DESIGN STANDARDS, SECTION 130-59 DESIGN STANDARDS FOR SPECIFIC USES (Bulkheads) OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, 1998

Councilmember Leckstein motion to introduce Ordinance # 12-2014 for a public hearing to be held on August 5, 2014 and advertise according to law; seconded by Councilmember Bills:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that Chapter 130 entitled "Land Use", Article IX Design Standards, Section 130-59 Design Standards for Specific Uses of an Ordinance entitled "Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, 1998", be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented in the following manner:

SECTION 1

CHAPTER 130 "Land Use"

Article IX, Design Standards for Specific Uses is hereby amended to include the following, with all other section not listed remaining the same.

§130-59 Design Standards for Specific Uses:

G. Bulkheads.

- 1. Bulkheads are required at locations that abut the Shrewsbury River and/or the Sandy Hook Bay and shall be located along the river's edge. In areas where beach exists along the river, the bulkhead shall be located in the same line as the abutting bulkhead to the north and south, permitting beach to the west of said bulkhead.
- 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section §130-46C, in the case of previously existing bulkhead structures, destroyed by reason of windstorm, fire, flood, explosion or other natural catastrophe or act of God or the public enemy to an extent of less than 50% of the linear foot of total bulkhead on the property, then such destruction shall be deemed to be "Partial Destruction" and may be rebuilt restored or repaired. Nothing in this chapter shall prevent the strengthening or restoring to a safe condition any wall, floor or roof which has been declared unsafe by the Building Inspector or other competent legal authority having jurisdiction.

3. All newly constructed bulkheads, bulkheads repaired that exceed more than 50% of the linear foot of bulkhead on the property, and damaged bulkheads that are not "partially destroyed," as defined above in Section B, shall be constructed at a <u>minimum</u> elevation of 7 feet (NAVD88) and shall be constructed of steel, aluminum, vinyl or other approved material. All connections to adjacent bulkheads shall be constructed in a manner to provide a water tight connection. All bulkhead designs and connections shall be designed by a Professional Engineer, licensed in the State of New Jersey.

- 4. All existing bulkheads that are damaged to a condition that can be determined as "partial destruction" as defined above in Section B, can be rebuilt, restored or repaired to existing conditions.
- 5. All property owners requesting permits to construct new bulkheads or repair existing bulkheads shall be required to submit all plans to the Municipal Zoning Officer who may defer to the Municipal Engineer for design approval and conformance to the zoning standards.
- 6, Bulkhead construction is subject to review by CAFRA and/or Waterfront Development and/or the Coastal General Permit Process.

Restoration. If any nonconforming structure or use shall be destroyed by reason of windstorm, fire, explosion or other act of God or the public enemy to an extent of less than 75% of the recorded true valuation, as shown by the tax assessment, then such destruction shall be deemed to be partial destruction and may be rebuilt, restored or repaired. Nothing in this chapter shall prevent the strengthening or restoring to a safe condition any wall, floor or roof which has been declared unsafe by the Building Inspector or other competent legal authority having jurisdiction.

SECTION II

All other ordinances or parts thereof enacted prior to the adoption of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION III

If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjusted invalid such subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall take effect as provided by law after its final passage.

2014 MUNICIPAL BUDGET AMENDMENT

<u>PUBLIC HEARING - RES No. 107 –2014</u> Amending the 2014 Municipal Budget Borough CFO Bascom reported this amendment is a result of an adjustment to the amount of money we received from the Essential Services Grant. We received the maximum amount that we are eligible for. Overall, we have a very stable strong budget that will allow the Borough to take the necessary steps for recovery and rebuilding. Mr. Bascom anticipates that the State will be helping us again next year and also in 2016.

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to open the public hearing on the 2014 Municipal Budget Amendment, seconded by Councilmember Bills:

Vince LaPoire, 35 Marine Terrace, Long Branch, inquired about the CDBG Grant and the inconsistency of the amount we qualified for vs. the amount we were eligible for. CFO Bascom explained the initial application process was based on the total amount of the Community Disaster Loan and the Essential Services Grant that the Borough received last year. We were allowed to apply for up to 75% of that number. When the process was finalized after receiving the federal regulations on how the money must to be spent, the Borough was only eligible for funds that could be proven were a shortfall as a result of the storm - of which we would receive 90%.

Jean Kingman, 36 Waterview Way, asked if the Borough had found money in the budget to pay for the beach rake. Attorney McNamara advised Ms. Kingman that this was a public hearing on the budget amendment. Councilman Kelly advised Ms. Kingman that they are working on funding and it would be on the next Council Meeting agenda. Ms. Kingman also commented on how the money at the beach is collected and asked how it is handled and believes we should be using a card reader.

Janet Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, asked about the amount of increase in "Streets and Roads Maintenance" - salaries and expenses increase. CFO Bascom answered her question.

Courtney Davis, 24 Beach Street, asked the purpose of the new chain link fence on the seawall. Councilman Murphy responded that it was replacing the chain link fence that had been destroyed in Sandy to keep people off the wall and dunes and to keep access to the beach at official access points. Borough Administrator Verruni responded that insurance proceeds paid for the replacement of the fence. Efforts were made to find a more "attractive" fence but when all factors were considered, the chain link fence was best for our needs. Ms. Davis continued that she would request matters such as this to be put on an agenda prior to taking action.

Susie Markson, 1187 Ocean Avenue, commented that the chain link fence looks terrible and there has to be other options.

Jean Kingman, 36 Waterview Way, this fence project should have come before the Beautification Committee. Residents are very unhappy when the Borough takes this type of action without their input. Ms Kingman feels the town is going backwards putting up a fence like that.

Butch Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, asked if the Borough had a Beach Manager. Councilwoman Bills responded that we do not have that official position filled but the responsibilities are split between two positions we currently have filled. Mr. Hentschel feels it should be managed by one person who will oversee everything.

Vince LaPoire, 35 Marine Terrace, Long Branch, asked council to consider waiting to introduce Ordinance 12-2014 until after the DEP hearings taking place concerning bulkhead construction as the outcome might impact the Ordinance.

Barbara Nadler, 656 Ocean Avenue, asked when the Anchorage Apartments would be taken down and for the status of the abandoned properties. Borough Attorney McNamara responded that it is the Anchorage property owner's responsibility to demo the building and he wasn't sure what the current status was. In regards to abandoned properties, McNamara explained that we are currently holding hearings with property owners to try toget things cleaned up. Ms. Nadler also inquired about raising the height of the seawall and if so could a board walk be built on top. Ms. Nadler asked about the status of the

Gators project; Borough Attorney McNamara said they are still in discussions with the DEP over the issues with the CAFRA permit. Also commented that the "Greetings from Sea Bright" mural is great.

Janet Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, agrees that the chain link fence is a horrible addition. Also, stated the beach is our best asset and we should have a manager running it properly.

Pamela Caputo, Eatontown, asked if the Borough would be interested in having a Farmer's Market. Her organization would be able to get it up and running and volunteers from the Borough would help run the market. Ms. Caputo stated she would be able to get this market up and running within two weeks once she receives Council approval. Council agreed to discuss this at the next Workshop meeting. Courtney Davis responded that this would be great for "Sustainable" Sea Bright.
