Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered the following Resolution for adoption; seconded by Councilmember Keeler:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright (the "Governmental Entity") has entered into continuing disclosure agreement(s) in connection with certain of its prior bond and/or note issuance(s) (the "Prior Issuances"), agreeing to file certain financial information and operating data and/or certain enumerated event notices with the former nationally recognized municipal securities information repositories or the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB") pursuant to the provisions of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "Rule"); and

WHEREAS, the Governmental Entity has made certain representations regarding its continuing disclosures in bond and note offering documents in connection with its Prior Issuances; and

WHEREAS, in response to widespread concerns that many municipal issuers have not been complying with their obligations to file continuing disclosure documents under the Rule, and furthermore have made false representations concerning compliance in bond and note offering documents, the Division of Enforcement (the "Division") of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Commission") has set forth its Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation Initiative (the "MCDC Initiative"), attached hereto as Exhibit A, whereby the Commission will recommend favorable settlement terms to municipal issuers involved in the offer or sale of municipal securities, as well as underwriters of such offerings, if they self-report to the Division possible violations involving materially inaccurate statements in bond and note offering documents relating to prior compliance with continuing disclosure obligations pursuant to the Rule; and

WHEREAS, pursuant the Local Finance Notice 2014-9, attached hereto as Exhibit B, the Director of the Local Finance Board, Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, has recommended the undertaking of a Review (as hereinafter defined) by all municipal issuers and participation in the MCDC Initiative, where appropriate, as determined by the facts of each Review (the "LFB Recommendation");

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONNECTION WITH THE LFB RECOMMENDATION, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, as follows:

Section 1. The Governmental Entity, through its Chief Financial Officer or through the engagement of a third-party disclosure-dissemination agent, is hereby directed to conduct a continuing disclosure review of its prior continuing disclosure undertakings (the "Review"), and the Governmental Entity hereby ratifies any such previously conducted Review. Such Review shall include, but is not limited to, a historical review of the Governmental Entity's continuing disclosure obligations and filings in connection with its Prior Issuances that are presently outstanding and which are no longer outstanding but, as of the date five years prior to the date of submission of the Questionnaire (as hereinafter defined), were outstanding; and the undertaking, at any time, of any applicable remedial filings with the MSRB deemed necessary for compliance with its continuing disclosure obligations.

Section 2. The Governmental Entity, through its Chief Financial Officer, is hereby authorized to participate in the MCDC Initiative, if in the discretion of the Chief Financial Officer after consultation with Governmental Entity officials, it is determined that the Governmental Entity may have made materially inaccurate statements in its bond and note offering documents relating to prior compliance with continuing disclosure obligations pursuant to the Rule in connection with its Prior Issuances issued during the period beginning five years prior to the date of submission of the Questionnaire.

Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer of the Governmental Entity is hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments, including the Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation Initiative Questionnaire for Self-Reporting Entities contained in the MCDC Initiative (the "Questionnaire"), and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for participating in the MCDC Initiative and all related transactions, including the Review, contemplated by this resolution.

Section 4. All resolutions or proceedings, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough Sea Bright has introduced and adopted Ordinance No. 14-2014, amending and supplementing Chapter 130 "Land Use" Article IX Design Standards, Section 130-59 Design Standards For Specific Uses (Bulkheads) of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, 1998; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the introduction of this Ordinance, the Ordinance was referred to the Planning Board of the Borough of Sea Bright for their review and comment; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting on October 14, 2014, the Planning Board reviewed the aforesaid Ordinance and expressed numerous concerns; and

WHEREAS, the concerns of the Board were memorialized in an October 16, 2014, letter to the Mayor and Borough Council from the Board Chairman, C. Lance Cunningham; and

WHEREAS, after further deliberation, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright has decided to proceed with adoption of Ordinance No. 14-2014 as introduced, without amendments as requested by the Planning Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, as follows:

1. The adoption of Ordinance No. 14-2014, in the opinion of the Members of the Borough Council, is consistent with the Master Plan of the Borough of Sea Bright.

2. The provisions set forth in Ordinance No. 14-2014 do not supersede the requirements under the various programs of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP"), which may regulate bulkhead construction under the provisions of the Coastal Area Facility Review Act (CAFRA), the Waterfront Development Act, the general coastal permit process and implementing regulations for said programs issued and administered by the NJDEP.

3. The action being taken by the adoption of Ordinance No. 14-2014 is for the protection of the public health, safety and general welfare of the residents and businesses of the community of the Borough of Sea Bright, in order to foster measures that can be taken to protect life and property within the Borough.

4. The Ordinance, specifically in paragraph 1, addresses the need to protect beaches where beach exists along the Shrewsbury River where new bulkheads will not be required.

5. The provision requiring bulkhead designs and construction to be designed by a professional engineer are to insure the applicable construction standards are adhered to, so that future bulkhead designs and construction are in accordance with the applicable laws of the State of New Jersey. It is the position of the Borough Council that this requirement is neither onerous nor a deterrent for the construction of new or rebuilt bulkheads in the Borough.

COUNCILCOMMITTEE REPORTS:

BEACH / PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Committee Chair Lamia reported he surveyed the beach with the OEM Director to see how the beach survived the storms to date. The dunes look very healthy but there is a lot of beach erosion in the north end of town. We identified several unauthorized crossovers. The Dune Committee is meeting this Saturday to discuss plans for the spring that won't interfere with the seawall project. Councilman Lamia reported he also visited the temporary firehouse on South Street and got a really good overview on the equipment we

have and how the operation works. The SeaBreeze editor will be ready to publish soon so please submit any material you have as soon as possible. The website is up and running and has been updated with calendars, agendas, minutes, etc. and audio will be coming soon. The website works best with Internet Explorer 11, Google Chrome, Firefox....it has issues with older versions of Internet Explorer. Mayor Long acknowledged and thanked Councilman Lamia for all his hard work.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT-CODE ENFORCEMENT/COURT/PUBLIC WORKS & CULTURAL ARTS:

Committee Chair Leckstein reported Code Enforcement has been working overtime and has made a lot progress at 1260 Ocean Avenue and at a building in the downtown area. Public Works is looking into purchasing a street sweeper and splitting the costs with another municipality. We are currently borrowing the County's sweeper. Reported progress on all other matters.

FINANCE / INSURANCE / GRANTS:

Committee Chair Keeler reported the CFO was able to issue special emergency notes to Valley National Bank for an exceptionally low interest rate which will be very helpful to us financially. Andrew Knox & Co are applying to the appeal board on our behalf for the Sandy payouts under the insurance losses. They are going to FEMA as there are still questions about the Firehouse. There will be an arbitration meeting on December 2, 2014. The JIF announced they will be paying out a dividend of approximately \$1 million; Sea Bright will receive approximately \$16-17,000. Councilman Keeler thanked Administrative Fire Chief Murphy for all his work on the Assistance to Firefighters Grant. Councilman Keeler reminded Council the JIF is offering an educational seminar at the League of Municipalities Conference and the Borough will receive a \$250 credit for every representative from the Borough to attend. The JIF is also offering a course on cyber attack risks which he would urge everyone to attend.

PERSONNEL/ EDUCATION/ LIBRARY / RECREATION:

Mayor Long reported in Committee Chair Bills' absence and thanked our Fire Department, First Aid, the Fire Ladies Auxillary, First United Methodist Church and the Recreation Department for putting together another great halloween celebration. The Recreation Department is finalizing the schedule of upcoming holiday events.

PUBLIC SAFETY / POLICE FIRE OEM / WATER SAFETY:

Mayor Long reported progress in Committee Chair LoBiondo's absence.

SEA BRIGHT RECOVERY / MASTER PLAN / BEAUTIFICATION:

Committee Chair Kelly reported there is progress on the Community Center; the project is going through the CAFRA permitting process and the architect is working on a design to get the most out of the building. The cell tower contract was awarded to Verizon. This project is also going through the CAFRA permitting process. The holiday lighting in downtown is going up this week. Work on the landscape master plan continues and should be ready to roll out in the spring.

MAYOR DINA LONG

Congratulated the winners of the recent election - Councilman John Lamia and new Councilman Charles Rooney III.

We are moving forward to try to find a home for the temporary library and hopes we are getting close to a final decision.

Sea Bright has been awarded a \$1.288 million grant for Streetscaping from New Jersey Economic Development Authority. We will now have funding to make improvements on our streetscape in the downtown area which should have a huge safety and visual impact.

The Year-end Reorganization meeting is approaching. The Borough will be making new appointments for the Community Advisory Committees. Mayor Long made a plea to get more people involved in a formal way by joining some of the Borough Committees.

Mayor Long made the following announcements:

- NJLM Conference in Atlantic City November18, 19, 20
- Borough Offices will be closed November 27 and 28 for Thanksgiving
- Christmas Tree Lighting Friday, December 5 at 7 PM at the Firehouse. Immediately following - a visit with Mr. and Mrs. Claus at the United Methodist Church - hot chocolate and cookies will be served.

Jean Kingman, 36 Waterview, acknowledged and thanked Linda Richter for all the work she has done on the Streetscape Grant. Also, said they are looking for names of families in the Borough that might need some gift/food assistance over the holidays.

Linda Lamia, 2 Village Road, thanked all those working on abandoned properties - 1260 Ocean Avenue looks better than it has in a long time. Ms. Lamia asked Council to consider, as they address abandoned properties, to assist those property owners better as most are in need. Commented that the website looks great. Asked Council to consider solar lighting for the municipal parking lot and for any streetscape projects.
