RESOLUTION NO. 52-2016
**AUTHORIZING SEWERAGE RATES AND CHARGES FOR SECOND, THIRD AND
FOURTH QUARTERS OF 2016 AND FIRST QUARTER OF 2017**

Councilmember _____ introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution;
seconded by Councilmember _____ ;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright authorized the rates and charges of the municipal public utility for sewerage for the second, third and fourth quarter of 2016 and the first quarter of 2017.

WHEREAS, any previous schedule of charges adopted by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright which are inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded.

WHEREAS, the rates and charges for the utilities are as follows:

1. The 2016 second, third and fourth and 2017 first quarter sewerage rate will be at the rate of \$9.90 for every 1,000 gallons of water consumed by the customer.

2. The charges shall be due and payable in 2016 and 2017 within 10 days after the due date of the municipal sewer utilities bill. If the bill is not timely paid, the outstanding bill shall be considered a municipal charge and shall be subject to the same rate of interest accruing on delinquent taxes. The second quarter billing in 2016 shall be mailed during July of 2016 which will be for consumption billed by the water company from mid March thru mid June. The third quarter billing in 2016 shall be mailed in October for consumption billed by the water company from mid June thru mid September. The fourth quarter 2016 billing shall be mailed in January 2017 for consumption billed by the water company from mid September thru mid December. The first quarter billing in 2017 shall be mailed during April 2017 for consumption billed by the water company from mid December 2016 thru mid March 2017.

3. Consumption shall be based upon the information provided to the Borough of Sea Bright Municipal Sewer Utility by the New Jersey American Water Company. The customers that are billed by the New Jersey American Water Company on a quarterly basis shall have their sewer charge based upon the quarterly water charges from New Jersey American Water Company. Those customers that are billed on a monthly basis by New Jersey American Water Company shall have their bills based upon their water consumption.

4. All customers of the municipal sewer utility shall be billed for at least 10,000 gallons quarterly. This minimum charge shall be \$99.00 for the second, third and fourth quarters of 2016 and the first quarter of 2017.

5. The consumption charges shall be billed to the metered townhouse or condominium association or corporation for payment.

6. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Charges shall be adjudged unconstitutional or to be ineffective in whole or in part, to the extent that it is not adjudged unconstitutional or is not effective, it shall be valid and effective; and no other section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Charges shall on account thereof be deemed invalid or ineffective and the inapplicability or invalidity of any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Schedule of Rates and Charges in any one or more instances or under any one or more circumstances shall not be taken to affect or prejudice in any way its applicability or validity in any other instances or under other circumstances.

7. A copy of same shall at all times be kept on file at the office of the Tax/Sewer Utility Collector at 1167 Ocean Avenue, Sea Bright, New Jersey and shall at all reasonable times be open to public inspection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that the utility is hereby authorized to publish a notice of final adoption of said Resolution of Rates and Charges.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that they hereby authorize the utility to forward a copy of said Resolution of Rates and Charges to the customers of the utility at the utility's discretion.

ORDINANCE No. 03-2016

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 182, "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS,
ARTICE V OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT PERTAINING TO THE TIME
PERIOD FOR REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE ON SIDEWALKS**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 182, "Streets and Sidewalks", Article V Snow and Ice Removal of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

"182-32. Snow and Ice Removal.

- A. With the exception of those undeveloped private lots abutting the sea wall on the eastern side of Ocean Avenue, the owner or tenant of land abutting upon the sidewalk of any other street or avenue shall remove all snow and ice from each sidewalk within 48 hours after same have formed or fallen thereon.
- B. If the event which caused the accumulation of snow and ice was so extraordinary that it would be a hardship to require owners or tenants to meet the 48 hour period set forth in subparagraph A herein, the Mayor shall notify the Borough Clerk, in writing, that the 48 hour period has been extended for a designated period of time, which shall not be more than an additional 48 hours. Only one such extension shall be permitted."

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 04-2016
AN ORDINANCE CREATING CHAPTER 37, GREEN INITIATIVES
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright strives to save tax dollars, assure clean air and water, protect ecological resources, improve working and living environments to build a community that is sustainable economically, environmentally and socially; a community which will thrive well into the new century; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright wish to build a model of government which benefits our residents and business community now and far into the future with green community initiatives which are easy to replicate and affordable to implement; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to focus attention on such "Green" issues, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright previously enacted Resolution # 43-2015 which created a Green Team for the Borough known as "Sustainable Sea Bright"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright now wish to make its "Sustainable Sea Bright" Green Team a permanent advisory committee on sustainable practices for the Borough; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright shall be amended so as to create a new Chapter 37 which shall be titled "Green Initiatives" and read as follows:

SECTION ONE:

§ 37-1 Establishment:

"Sustainable Sea Bright" is hereby established as a permanent advisory committee to the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright.

§ 37-2 Purpose:

The general purpose of the permanent Sustainable Sea Bright advisory committee shall include but not be limited to advising and making recommendations to the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright as to improved municipal operations by way of "green" initiatives which are economically and environmentally sound as demonstrated through research and evaluation.

§ 37-3 Definitions

All references to "committee" within Chapter 37, unless otherwise stated, shall refer to the permanent "Sustainable Sea Bright" advisory committee.

§ 37-4 Powers and Duties:

The powers and duties of the committee shall be:

- (A) Collaborate with Borough employees, service providers and other governmental agencies to share resource information and ideas consistent with the purpose of the committee;
- (B) Encourage participation of all borough employees, borough residents and borough businesses toward the solicitation of ideas for and engagement in projects working toward green initiatives
- (C) Research and analyze green initiatives which make practical and environmental and financial sense;
- (D) Manage Sea Bright's participation in the Sustainable Jersey program and facilitate the Borough's path toward full certification from that organization;
- (E) Make all information of the committee available to the public by way of keeping minutes of all committee meetings and maintaining records of all committee activities;
- (F) Advise and make recommendations to the Mayor and Borough Council on matters affecting "green" initiatives;
- (G) Develop strategies for sustainable "green" initiatives in municipal operations;
- (H) Seek to coordinate, assist, and unify the efforts of private groups, institutions, and individuals within the Borough of Sea Bright in accord with the purposes of this chapter;
- (I) Maintain a liaison and communication with the public, private agencies and organizations of local, state, and national scope, whose programs and activities have an impact on "green" initiatives;
- (J) Leverage the skills and expertise of committee members to develop plans, implement programs, and assist with educational opportunities that support the creation of a sustainable community;
- (K) Carry out such other duties as may be assigned to the committee from time to time by the Mayor and Borough Council.

§ 37-5 Membership and Term of Office:

- (A) The Membership of the Committee shall be appointed annually and initially consist of the following eleven (11) individuals:
- (i) The Borough Clerk, who shall act as the Chairman of the Committee
 - (ii) The Mayor of the Borough of Sea Bright
 - (iii) A Borough Council Member to be chosen by the Council
 - (iv) A second Borough Council Member to be chosen by the Council
 - (v) A member of the Borough Planning Board to be chosen by the Planning Board
 - (vi) The Superintendent of Public Works
 - (vii) The Borough's Public Safety Director
 - (viii) The Borough's Elected Representative on the Regional Board of Education
 - (ix) A citizen of the Borough of Sea Bright to be chosen by the Mayor
 - (x) A representative of a business located within the Borough of Sea Bright to be chosen by the Mayor
 - (xi) An individual of the Mayor's choosing, who will best serve to effectuate the goals of this Ordinance.
- (B) The eleven members of the committee stated in paragraph (A) of this section may be changed by a Resolution of the Borough Council, however under no circumstances may that membership fall below the number of eleven (11) or consist of an even number.

§ 37-6 Meetings:

The committee shall meet monthly. Additional meetings of the committee may be scheduled by the Chair at his/her discretion. Minutes of all meetings shall be kept by the committee's secretary who may or may not be a member of the committee. All minutes shall be kept on file in the Borough Clerk's office.

A quorum at any meeting of the committee shall be reached with the attendance of at least five (5) members of the committee.

The committee may also establish such other rules and procedures as may be necessary for its proper functioning, including, but certainly not limited to, the creation and disbanding of such subcommittees as it deems appropriate.

§ 37-7 Annual report:

The committee shall be required to file an annual report of its activities and achievements with the Mayor and Borough Council. The annual report may also include recommendations to the Mayor and Borough Council as may be necessary to fulfill the purposes of this Ordinance.

§ 37-8 Severability:

If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the specific section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 140, entitled "Mercantile Licenses", Article II "General Licenses," Section 140-6, of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended to read in full, as follows:

"140-6 Term of License; expiration; transfer.

All licenses shall commence July 1 and expire June 30 of the following year. On transfer of location of a licensed business to a new location within the Borough or upon the sale of an active business remaining in the Borough, licenses may be transferred, provided that the annual license fee for the year has been paid and a transfer fee of \$10 is paid to the Borough Clerk. All business operations commencing between July 1 and December 31 of any year shall be subject to the full amount of the annual license fee and all operations commencing between January 1 and June 30 of any year shall be subject to 1/2 of the annual license fee. Applications for renewal or transfer of a license shall be governed by the same procedures applicable to an original application."

SECTION TWO: Chapter 140, entitled "Mercantile Licenses," Article II "General Licenses," Subsection 140-10C, "Due Date," of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended to read in full, as follows:

"C. Due date. The due date is July 1 of every year."

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies

SECTION FOUR: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 182, "Streets and Sidewalks", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Article I, "Excavations", § 182-11.26, "Opening newly paved streets restricted."

be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

"§ 182-11.26. Opening newly paved streets restricted, Restoration.

No permit shall be issued by the Borough Clerk of the Borough of Sea Bright which would allow an excavation or opening of a paved or improved street surface less than five years old unless:

- A. The applicant can clearly demonstrate that public health or safety requires that the proposed work be permitted or unless an emergency condition exists; or
- B. The excavation or opening is for the purpose of providing utility services to a new residential or commercial structure constructed on a vacant lot or after the complete demolition of an existing structure. In such cases, restoration shall be accomplished utilizing infrared technology, as approved by the Borough Engineer."

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication according to law and upon filing with the Monmouth County Planning Board.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$136,271.21 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Sea Bright shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$136,271.21, and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Borough of Sea Bright be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.
