Mayor Long welcomed Congressman Pallone, Freeholders Serena DiMaso and Tom Arnone and Sheriff Golden and asked if anyone had a message they would like to pass along for 2016: Freeholder Tom Arnone offered a few words and commended all the hard work taking place in Sea Bright and wished everyone a successful 2016.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT WILLIAM (Jack) KEELER: 2015 YEAR END ADDRESS

2015 was about Recovery - we are in the third year since Sandy and believe we have another two years before we are back. Regarding finances - we are very fortunate to have Mr. Michael Bascom serve as our CFO. The Borough has received a great deal of state assistance in the recovery which requires a lot of record keeping and thanks for Mr. Bascom for his successful efforts which continues our good relationship with the Division of Local Government Services. FEMA has also provided a great deal of assistance and with each we are required to justify every bit of spending .One of the effects of the storm was significant drop in property values in Sea Bright.

Budget is in good standing. Shore Regional has an excellent reputation and our children are getting a great education - however, we are severely impacted by the state tax formula. The Mayor has worked with the school committee in Sea Bright to come up with a strategy. Oceanport is talking about replacing and renovating the schools for \$30-32 million and there is concern on how much of that will fall on Sea Bright. The sand project was great for Sea Bright. Volunteers were working on the sand dunes and you can noticeably see the difference between Sea Bright and Monmouth Beach. The Library has reopened in the Sea Bright United Methodist Church. Beach Clubs are an excellent service. It's a place where people can relax, there are lifeguards, and can enjoy the beach. When you enter into Sea Bright over the bridge there is a sense of optimism when you see the businesses and beach clubs. Thank you to the business owners and residents on making an effort to bring Sea Bright back. The Fire Department and First Aid lost their building and equipment. The Fire Department now has 10 new members and 50 active members. They responded to 380 calls in 2015. Sea Bright has the only water rescue capability in the Shrewsbury River. Hats off to the Fire Department members. The First Aid has 8 members and had 223 service calls in 2015.

Movies on the beach had a very successful year; trunk or treat in the parking lot was a great Halloween event for the children. The Halloween parade and the children's Christmas party were again, very successful events.

2015 was a recovery year - 2 more years to go and we will be back! I commend everyone and thank you to members of the governing body, borough employees and all the volunteers!

REPORT FROM COUNCILMAN LAMIA

Spirit of Community. It's been three years plus. Thanked the BSB because every time we ask them for help they come forward. Thanks to the beach management - we had over 70,000 visitors at the beach this year. Everything heard about the beach this year was positive. We generated \$600,000 in revenue. We had a junior lifeguard program which was really amazing. The dune committee coordinated hundreds of volunteers to establish dunes along the entire length of the beach with assistance from the public works department. Thanked Councilman Rooney for coordinating the palm trees on the beach. We piloted a program with SeaStreak to bring people down to Sea Bright. Thanked the Borough Administrator and Staff for all their successful efforts. Thank you to everyone who supports our town, Fire/EMS/Police. Thanks to our Borough Engineer for persevering obstacles. The Library looks great. Thanks to the residents. Thank you Mayor Long for your leadership. God Bless America.

REPORT FROM COUNCILMAN ROONEY

Happy New Year. We are coming back. Councilman Keeler and Lamia did a great job. This year Sea Bright's public safety made the move to county radio which was a big success. Hurricane Sandy proved that we needed to be a part of something bigger and it is cost effective for our residents. OEM is moving forward with new training and additional equipment and keeping Sea Bright up to date. The Fire Department will continue to move forward with new training as well. The Police Department will have promotions in a few weeks and six new specials will be coming out of police academy this year. The municipal parking lot was packed from Wednesday to Sunday throughout the summer. Sea Bright is definitely on its way back. This town is a very special and amazing place. As for Capital Improvements there are two facilities that we plan to break ground on in 2016. Those buildings are the beach pavilion and the public safety pavilion. Once all of the proper funding is approved and the permits are complete, will move forward. MAYOR DINA LONG:

2016 NEW YEAR MESSAGE

Good afternoon. Thank you so much for taking time out of your busy schedules to be with us today. We were honored to have so many residents, loved ones and elected representatives here with us today.

Before I start I'd like to take a moment to especially recognize and thank the good men and women who work for the Borough of Sea Bright, our Police, the staff who work in this building or on the library or on the beach, our DPW, and our volunteer departments. Since Sandy, each one of us may have our own issues that we are trying to resolve. So imagine dealing with that times 1000. They are the unsung heroes of our town, and they should know all of us up here see when they go above and beyond, which is often, we appreciate it, and we are grateful for their efforts.

I also want to recognize the extraordinary service of the Borough Council. They are the ones working behind the scenes to make Sea Bright better, they have full lives, and yet they give inordinate amounts of time, with no compensation whatsoever, on behalf of our town.

I'd also just like to thank my husband Rob and son Sam; they are truly my rock. I'm sure I would not have gotten through the last four years without your amazing support. And my Mom, who gets all the credit for me being here in the first place.

So, four years ago, I stood in this gym and took the oath of office as Mayor of Sea Bright. I talked about how I came to be a Sea Brighter, I celebrated the fact that we have the most diverse, eclectic, talented and colorful collection of individuals ever to assembled on one three-mile sand bar. My good friend Mayor Maria Fernandes was sitting right up front, smiling from ear to ear, and anything seemed possible.

Ten month later Super Storm Sandy ripped through and proved that to be true, in the worst way possible. It washed away everything that was familiar and left us with the daunting task of picking up the pieces and putting it back right. Three years later I surprise myself sometimes at how close to the surface those emotions still are. The grief of loss especially. And yet, when I reflect back on those early times after the storm, I can see how anything was, and is, still possible, in the best way possible. Remember our collective determination. How, as bad as it was, we still never doubted that we'd get back and that it would somehow be ok.

People helped each other and supported each other, making no distinctions between one another, except that we were all together in this strong, colorful tribe of Sea Brighters. People came from around the country to help us, and with our gratitude came the resources we needed when we needed them most. In the midst of the direst circumstances, we brought a positive spirit and a cando attitude. Our town captured national attention, and even the Grammy-winning band Train came here and played a show, for us. I called it our Sea Bright Spirit.

Subsequently, I learned that psychologists recognize four phases of human disaster response, phase 2, the honeymoon phase, is known to be when people draw together to solve problems in an intense showing of community. Our so-called Sea Bright Spirit. (By the way, phase 3, "Disillusionment" follows, ending with a phase 4, "Reconstruction" phase.)

Alright, so maybe we were not all that unique, but it certainly was special, and that Sea Bright Spirit was real. Looking back, I see how important role that mindset played in our initial recovery. When we were grateful, abundance came. When we radiated positive energy, positive results were the outcome. It's just physics, really, if you think about it. How could you expect to get positive out of negative? Negative produces negative, positive produces positive. It's pretty simple.

So, going into my next term as Mayor, and into the new year, the message for me is the power of positive energy. The fact that anything IS possible., and we have the power to make it happen with our mindset. I do not mean be happy 365, or that we all need to agree, or even that we all like each other. What I do mean is bringing positive energy to the table, treating people how we want to be treated ourselves, making opportunity out of obstacles, and maintaining an attitude of gratitude. Experience proves that with these ingredients, our success is inevitable. God willing. God bless our beloved home town. Thank you.
