RESOLUTION No. 61-2016 Award of Contract Ocean Avenue Streetscape Improvements Project

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2015 the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright authorized the receipt of bids for the Ocean Avenue Streetscape Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Clerk did duly advertise on February 19, 2016 to receive bids on March 10, 2016 for the Ocean Avenue Streetscape Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, in connection therewith four (4) bids were received by the Borough Clerk on March 10, 2016 from the following: 1) Precise Construction Incorporated, Freehold, NJ for \$1,118,635.00; 2) LandTec Construction d/b/a United Terrain, Piscataway, NJ for \$1,142,548.00; 3) S. Batata Construction, Inc., Parlin, NJ for \$1,182,208.00; and 4) A-Tech Concrete Co., Edison, NJ for \$1,723,013.00; and

WHEREAS, it was determined that the lowest responsible bidder meeting specifications for this bid was Precise Construction Incorporated; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer recommends that a contract be awarded to Precise Construction Incorporated of Freehold, New Jersey as per their bid proposal for the Ocean Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project at a cost not to exceed \$1,118,635.00 subject to submission and approval of the required New Jersey Economic Development Authority documentation and approval of the Borough Attorney; and

ORDINANCES

Introduction: Mayor Long to read the ordinance by title:

ORDINANCE #08-2016

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDING FOR ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION OF A PARKING REVENUE SYSTEM FOR THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT AND APPROPRIATING \$95,000 FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to introduce Ordinance #08-2016, as amended to add a new Section Four (as follows), for a public hearing to be held on April 5, 2016 and advertise according to law; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

"SECTION FOUR: All of the specifics of Sea Bright's paid parking system shall be set forth in writing and presented to Council for approval." (Section Four becomes Five and Five becomes Six as indicated below)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey, authorizes for the acquisition and installation of a Parking Revenue System, including signage and parking lot improvements, and including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto for the Borough of Sea Bright, to be funded from the sources specified in Section 2 of the Ordinance.

SECTION TWO: The amount of \$95,000 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in Section 1 of the Ordinance and which amount was funded from the General Capital Improvement Fund in the amount of \$95,000.

SECTION THREE: In connection with the purpose and the amount authorized in Sections 1 and 2 hereof, the Borough determines the purpose described in Section 1 hereof is not a Current Expense and is an improvement which the Borough of Sea Bright may lawfully make as a general improvement.

SECTION FOUR: All of the specifics of Sea Bright's paid parking system shall be set forth in writing and presented to Council for approval.

SECTION FIVE: All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SECTION SIX: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon due passage and publication according to law.
