Mayor Long issued the Oath of Office to Officer Hendricks.

<u>REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE</u> (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Councilman Rooney asked Mayor Long to limit the comments to three minutes.

Marianne McKenzie, 612 Ocean Avenue, congratulated the council on putting a resolution on Friday's temporary agenda to rescind the paid parking for 2016, and is now shocked to see a totally different agenda. Ms. McKenzie stressed there is not a specific plan and the businesses and residents should be involved. She understands the Borough needs revenue but strongly believes that the way to accomplish this in 2016 is to raise the price of daily beach badge rates from \$8 to \$10.

Mayor Long stated that there is a meeting scheduled for business owners on May 11 before any plan is finalized to get their input on paid parking. The outcome of this meeting will be discussed at the May 12 workshop meeting.

Butch Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, believes that meeting with the businesses a few weeks before the parking system is installed is too little too late. The Council needs more time to make a plan with the businesses, residents, and visitors. As a resident, Mr. Hentschel said he uses the parking lot when there is no parking on the streets. He also thinks that if you increase the daily badges \$2, the Borough will make more money than they would with paid parking.

Vincent Lepore, Long Branch, stated if anyone questions why, he, a non-resident attends these meetings, it is because his tax dollars help support Sea Bright. Mr. Lepore stated he attended Shore Regional's recent board meeting and budget presentation and was surprised that the Shore board could not answer the question of how many students from Sea Bright attend the school. Mr. Lepore expressed his concerns about eminent domain in reference to the redevelopment investigation and suggested Attorney McLaughlin was less than transparent on this matter at the April 19th meeting and cited a number of statutes. Finally, Mr. Lepore requested that the Mayor and Council rescind the resolution for paid parking.

Mayor Long clarified that there are 18 students from Sea Bright, 96.5 students from Monmouth Beach, 215.5 students from Oceanport, and 279.5 students from West long Branch that attend Shore Regional based on student numbers from October of 2015. Sea Bright has 2% of the student body and pays for 13% of the budget. Mayor Long said that Shore is advertising a reduction in Sea Bright's taxes this year and explained we typically pay 13% of the budget, but after Sandy we lost half of our students due to displacement and became responsible for 20% of the budget - the reduction back to 13% is really stabilization to where we were before Sandy.

Attorney McLaughlin responded to Mr. Lepore's comments about transparency and explained Council isn't doing anything to establish condemnation in a redevelopment zone. Mr. McLaughlin explained the long process involved prior to the Council making any determination whether or not condemnation will be utilized.

Ruth Blaser, 408 Ocean Avenue, questioned if the Borough is considering getting out of the Shore Regional District. Mayor Long explained that the Borough is pursuing other options and is following the path laid out by statue and pleading their case with the Shore Regional school board.

ORDINANCE #13-2016 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 66, "BEACHES" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, 1998

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that Chapter 66 entitled "Beaches," Article I, General Regulations, of the "Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, 1998", be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented in the following manner:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 66, "Beaches," of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Article I, "General Regulations," §66-3, "Parking. Parking of automobiles on the parking lot of the Municipal Beach shall be permitted at a rate and at hours to be fixed by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright." be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented by the addition thereto of the following subsection:

"Parking of vehicles in the four municipal lots known as the: Anchorage Lot, Peninsula House Lot, Municipal Lot, Borough Hall Lot shall be permitted at a maximum rate of \$1 per hour in spaces designated for paid parking, subject to rules and regulations adopted by the Mayor and Council."

Amendment

"Parking of vehicles in the four municipal lots known as the: Anchorage Lot, Peninsula House Lot, Municipal Lot, Borough Hall Lot shall be permitted at such rates for paid parking as set forth in rules and regulations adopted annually by Resolution of the Mayor and Council."

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.
