ORDINANCE #19-2016 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE GENERAL CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, CHAPTER 201 ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, SECTION 201-42. RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING DESIGNATED

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to introduce Ordinance #19-2016, with the amendment indicated below, for a public hearing to be held on June 16, 2016 and advertise according to law; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I: Chapter 201, "Vehicles and Traffic", Section 201.42, "Residential Permit Parking Designated", subsection A of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright is hereby amended and supplemented to read in full as follows:

"A. No person shall park or cause to be parked any vehicle on streets or parts of streets as described within the following sections unless an appropriate and current parking permit issued by the Borough of Sea Bright is displayed on said vehicle for those streets or parts of streets as described or listed herein:

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.
