REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Vincent LePore, Long Branch, requested CFO Bascom to explain the budget in more detail and how the Governor's 10% Assistance factors in. In regards to the Redevelopment Resolution 135-2016 listed on the agenda, Mr. Lepore questioned if the property owners were aware of the litigation and requested Council, to avoid litigation, table the resolution for further review and discussion, if not, he would like to see a no vote and would like to hear each councilmember's reasoning for their vote.

Pamela Ross, 6 Peninsula, questioned if Council is considering revising the noise Ordinance - and mentioned the loud noise emanating from Tommy's and sympathizes with the people who live nearby in the apartments. Mayor Long explained that she has spoken about this issue with Councilman Leckstein and explained the current Ordinance does not address "non- amplified" noise. Council has discussed ways to limit that type of noise, however, it has not gotten to a proposal stage. Councilman Leckstein said that they are working on it and hope to have something prepared for discussion at a workshop meeting before the end of the year.

Jean Kingman, stated the recent approvals of the planning board need to be addressed because the decisions they have been making have not been good. She thinks that the Council influences the planning board. Her biggest complaint with Council is that big decisions are made without the majority of the residents being involved. In regards to the noise Ordinance - she questioned the Borough's laws in comparison to the State's. Mayor Long explained that the Borough's ordinance cannot be a higher standard that State regulation.

A RESOLUTION TO AFFIRM THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT'S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered the following resolution for approval; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Borough of Sea Bright to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Sea Bright has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ADOPTED by the Borough of Sea Bright that:

- **Section 1**: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Borough of Sea Bright by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Borough shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Borough's business or using the facilities or property of the Borough.
- **Section 2**: The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Borough to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Borough.
- **Section 3**: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.
- **Section 4:** The Borough Administrator shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.
- **Section 5**: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.
- **Section 6**: The Borough Administrator shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Borough as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.
- **Section 7**: The Borough Administrator shall establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the governing body the results of the monitoring.
- **Section 8**: At least annually, the Borough Administrator shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Borough. This communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be placed on the Borough's web site.
- **Section 9**: This resolution shall take effect immediately.
- **Section 10**: A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of the Borough in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Borough's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

2016 MUNICIPAL BUDGET AMENDMENT

Mayor Long asked CFO Bascom to explain this amendment. Mr. Bascom explained that when we introduced the budget we were uncomfortable with the amount of surplus that we were utilizing to make the budget balance. As a result, the Borough applied for a 4th round Essential Services Grant for the maximum allowed to us of \$360,000 even though we were able to document \$420,000 in need. The Essential Services Grant turned out not to be a funded program this year but the State identified a different funding source that was able to provide the Borough with a grant of \$416,239.32. This revenue will reduce the amount of surplus utilized in the budget which allows the Borough to continue forward with recovery efforts by maintaining some stability financially. Mayor Long asked if this will help our Moody's rating - Mr. Bascom said it allows us to maintain our stable outlook.

Mr. Bascom said there will be a separate grant request for our 10% matching share which will cover reimbursements for projects where we only received 90% FEMA reimbursement and the Borough paid the 10% balance. This money will go back into our fund balance. Mr. Bascom said the reason this amendment did not require a public hearing is because it didn't change any appropriation in the budget or the amount to be raised by taxation.
