WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright approved Resolution 113-2016 on October 4, 2016, awarding a contract for the Ocean Avenue Streetscape Improvements Project to LandTek Construction and a Notice to Proceed with issued by the Borough Engineer on November 10, 2016; and

WHEREAS, during the course of the project, LandTek Construction encountered an Underground Storage Tank (UST) located under the sidewalk adjacent to Rooney Plaza on Ocean Avenue near the corner of Surf Street; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is desirous of removing the UST as soon as possible to avoid project delays with the ongoing streetscape project; and

WHEREAS, T & M Associates, Borough Engineer Francis Mullen, submitted a Work Task Order Proposal, dated February 6, 2017, consisting of a Scope and Fee Estimate related to the removal of said UST, as follows:

- Estimated cost of removal of tank by a qualified Certified UST Contractor approximately \$5,000.00 to \$8,000.00
- 2. T&M Associate's Fee not to exceed \$3,450.00 to be billed in accordance with the 2017 General Engineering Contract and Rate Schedule.
- 3. Estimated Fee for soil sampling (if required) \$700.00

WHEREAS, the Borough will be reimbursed for expenses not to exceed \$10,000.00 from the Joint Insurance Fund for the cost of removing the UST.

Dear Mr. Verruni:

T&M Associates (T&M) has prepared this Work Task Order Proposal for your consideration associated with the underground storage tank (UST) uncovered during the ongoing streetscape project located on Ocean Ave. This proposal encompasses activities to be performed by T&M in accordance the Linear Construction technical guidance if the Borough of Sea Bright elects to remove the UST.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

As you know, during excavation for the light pole foundations on Ocean Avenue near Surf Street, a UST was encountered, approximately 12" below grade. Based on field observations by environmental staff during the on-site the tank appears to be 550-gallons in capacity. It is unknown at this time if the tank is full of product or if there has been any leakage. In addition, the contents of tank is also unknown, however, based on the size of the tank and location, it is suspected that the tank contents heating oil. Since the tank capacity is less than 2,000-gallons and is suspected to content heating oil, this tank is not regulated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Project (NJDEP). Therefore, the Borough has following options:

- Option #1 (Leave UST In-Place): Since the UST is not regulated by the NJDEP, the Borough could leave the UST in-place. T&M recommends that the Borough check their local ordinance to confirm there is no rule requiring the Borough to remove the uncovered UST. In addition, T&M recommends that the Borough notify all potential responsible parties (e.g., DOT, adjacent property [Rooney's Plaza], etc.) that a UST was uncovered.
- Option #2 (Remove UST): The Borough could remove the UST in accordance with the Construction technical guidance to avoid any delays with the ongoing streetscape project. The Borough would remove UST in accordance with the closure requirements of Underground Storage Tank regulations (N.J.A.C. 7:14B-9). Since the Borough is not the responsible party, no remediation of soil or groundwater would be performed. As recommended in Option #1, the Borough should notify all potential responsible parties (e.g., DOT, adjacent property [Rooney's Plaza], etc.) that a UST was uncovered.

Based on the suspected age of the UST and potential for the UST to be leaking or will leak in the future, T&M recommends that the Borough proceed with Option #2 and remove the UST in accordance with the Linear Construction technical guidance.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

In order to remove this UST as recommended in Option #2 above, the Borough will need to retain a Certified UST contractor. Since the not regulated by the NJDEP, removal of the UST will require inspection by the Borough's inspector as well as our environmental staff. The proposed work tasks are as follows:

- T&M will prepare a scope of work for the project including all performance requirements;
- Issue Requests for Proposals to 3-6 qualified Certified UST contractors for the removal of the UST (Assuming the UST has not leaked, the estimated cost for the removal is approximately \$5,000 to \$8,000.);
- Review of proposals submitted by qualified Certified UST contractors, references and preparation of a Recommendation of Award;
- Coordination of a brief preconstruction meeting for the project;
- Coordination of the work with LandTek, the contractor for the Streetscape project; and,
- Inspection of the removal of the tank.

Since this is not a regulated UST, soil sampling would not be required if no evidence of a discharge is observed. To protect the Borough in the future, the Borough may desire to collect post-closure soil samples to confirm the presence or absence of any impacts. We should discuss benefits of doing so.

Notification Requirements: Please be advised that in the course of performing the UST removal, if evidence of a discharge of hazardous substances or hazardous waste is found (stained soils, holes in the UST shell, sheen on the groundwater, etc.) or if free-flowing product is discovered, THE DISCHARGE MUST BE REPORTED TO THE NJDEP HOTLINE IMMEDIATELY.

SCHEDULE AND FEES

The Borough shall proceed with the proposed work as outlined above immediately to avoid any delays with the ongoing streetscape project. It is anticipated that proposed work could be completed in the next 7 to 10 days once the Borough has retained a Certified UST contractor.

Our fees for the proposed work services outlined above, including reproduction costs and miscellaneous reimbursables, shall not exceed an estimated total amount of approximately \$3,450 and will be billed in accordance with our 2017 General Engineering contract and rate schedule.

If the Borough elects to collect post-closure soil samples, the cost for would be in addition to our above Cost. The estimated total amount for soil sampling is \$700.

ORDINANCE NO. 04-2017 CALENDAR YEAR 2017

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2017 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 141,471.90 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2017 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Sea Bright shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$165,050.55, and that the CY 2017 municipal budget for the Borough of Sea Bright be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.
