Fran Rooney Raffetto - on behalf of Beachwalk Cafe in Sea Bright - presented the Mayor with \$1,941 collected from the new year's day polar bear plunge, for the First Aid Squad and said there was an additional \$400 forthcoming. Fran thanked Liz Von Ziegesar and Chuck McQuillan for their generous donations. Mayor Long thanked all for their generosity on behalf of the First Aid Squad.

Vince Lepore, Long Branch, made comments on the Monmouth County Open Space Funding grant for some of the small "pocket" parks in the Borough in future years cumulatively.

Pam Ross, 6 Peninsula, asked for a status report on the noise ordinance. Mayor Long explained that council continues to discuss - there is a proposed ordinance change that deals with the decibel meter portion of the ordinance and said there needs to be additional discussion concerning changes which would prevent nuisance noise.

ORDINANCE No. 01-2017

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 61, ENTITLED "ANIMALS" ARTICLE 1 "DOGS", SECTION 61-7 LICENSING, VACCINATION AND REGISTRATION; FEES AND ARTICLE II "CATS", SECTION 61-13. LICENSING REQUIREMENTS OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to introduce Ordinance #01-2017 for a public hearing to be held on February 7, 2017 and advertise according to law; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, as follows:

SECTION I: Chapter 61, "Animals", Article I, Dogs, of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

61.7 Licensing, vaccination and registration; fees.

- a) The owners of all dogs seven months of age or older are required to apply annually, between January 1st and June 30th, to the licensing clerk of the municipality for a dog license. In order for the license to be issued, the owner must present proof that a licensed veterinarian has vaccinated the dog against rabies and that the duration of immunity from that vaccination extends through at least ten months of the twelve-month licensing period. A valid license from another municipality shall be accepted.
- b) Each and every dog shall be duly licensed and shall bear evidence of such license at all time in accordance with the Laws of the State of New Jersey. The annual fee for such license shall be \$12 for each spayed/neutered dog and \$15 for each unspayed/unneutered dog. Said licenses, registration tags and renewals thereof shall expire no later than June 30th. There will be a late fee of \$5 for any licenses issued after June 30th.

SECTION II: Chapter 61, "Animals", Article II, Cats, of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

61.13. Licensing requirements.

- G. License fee schedule. A license shall be \$12 for each spayed/neutered cat and \$15 for each unspayed/unneutered cat. Said licenses, registration tags and renewals thereof shall expire no later than June 30^{th} . There will be a late fee of \$5 for any licenses issued after June 30.
- H. Fees, renewals, expiration date of license. A valid license from another municipality shall be accepted.
- (1) The person applying for the license and registration tag and/or sleeve shall pay the fee fixed or authorized. Said licenses, registration tags or sleeve and renewals thereof shall expire no later than June 30th.

SECTION III: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies

SECTION IV: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION V: This Ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE No. 02-2017

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 130, "LAND USE", ARTICLE VII, "AREA, BULK AND USE REQUIREMENTS" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, SECTION 130-49, "USES PERMITTED" TO ADD SEASONAL PARKING FACILITIES AS AN EXAMPLE OF A PERMITTED TEMPORARY USE

Councilman Leckstein commented he was originally opposed to this ordinance, but feels it has come a very long way and Council has addresses many of his concerns and thanked everyone for all the time and effort they put into this.

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to introduce Ordinance #02-2017 for a public hearing to be held on February 7, 2017 and advertise according to law; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright recognize that there is a serious shortage of available parking in the Borough during the summer season; and

WHEREAS, Section 130-49 of Chapter 130, "Land Use" permits temporary uses for limited periods of time in order to "serve the needs and convenience of the Borough of Sea Bright and the general public";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, that Chapter 130, "Land Use", of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, shall be amended as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 130-49F, "Temporary Uses", subsection 130-49F(2), "Examples of Temporary Uses", be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to add the following subparagraph:

"(d) Seasonal Parking Facilities on vacant lots located in the B1 and BR Zoning Districts, from Memorial Day through Labor Day, subject to reasonable conditions established by the zoning officer. An application shall be submitted on an annual basis together with a review fee of \$300."

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication according to law and upon filing with the Monmouth County Planning Board.
