Authorizing the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division to Conduct Aerial Mosquito Control Operations within the Borough of Sea Bright

RESOLUTION No. 48-2017 Authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division to Conduct Aerial Mosquito Control Operations Within the Borough of Sea Bright

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Keeler:

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitoes within the County; and **WHEREAS,** the County has instituted an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control, and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the County of Monmouth; and

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated "congested area," the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the municipality designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a health hazard, or both with the understanding that:

- a. the County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
- b. such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
- c. the County will notify the police department of each municipality over which aerial pesticide operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

BEACH / GRANTS:

Committee Chair Lamia reported the committee reviewed an aerial view, provided by the Mayor, of the dunes from downtown through north beach which will service as a good template for how the dunes look today. As there was a lot of dune fencing that came down in recent storms, the dune committee is working with the administrator to replace it. Reported progress on all other matters.

FINANCE / INSURANCE / COURT / VOLUNTEERS:

Committee Chair Keeler reminded all that there will be a budget workshop meeting on March 7, 2017 at 5 pm. CFO Bascom is still tweaking the final numbers. Councilman Keeler reported the JIF came out with their 2017 Safety and Compliance Program and reported the big focus in 2017 will be on the first responders. JIF representatives will be setting up a meeting with Sea Bright's first aid and fire departments to go over procedures. Councilman Keeler reported that the appointment of an Alternate Prosecutor was approved earlier on the consent agenda. Reported progress on all other matters.

PERSONNEL/ PUBLIC RELATIONS / RECREATION:

Committee Chair Leckstein commented on the promotions and new hire within the Police Department and the hiring of the new alternate prosecutor. Regarding Public Relations, Councilman Leckstein reported they had their first meeting and firmed up Saturday, April 22 for the third annual Sea Bright Kite Day which also happens to be Earth Day. Councilman Leckstein reported the Planning Board continues to work on the Master Plan and said new legislation may soon require public access to be included in the Plan. Councilman Leckstein announced the Oceanport Board of Education's monthly meeting is tomorrow evening at 6 pm at Maple Place School and there will be a presentation on the referendum for the reconstruction of Wolf Hill and Maple Place schools. Reported progress on all other matters.

PUBLIC SAFETY / EDUCATION / LIBRARY:

Committee Chair Rooney reported they are working on recruiting lifeguards for the 2017 season as the Borough will be lifeguarding in Highlands this summer. Councilman Rooney commended Chief Sorrentino for the amazing job he is doing putting together a exemplary Police Department for the future of Sea Bright. Mayor Long added her congratulations. Councilman Rooney reviewed and compared the number of calls for service, motor vehicle stops, tickets, DWI's and other statistics for the years 2015 and 2016. Councilman Rooney said he has been working with the Chief to promote bike safety this year. Regarding the Library, Councilman Rooney reported he held another organ recital this past Saturday; he brought the plans for the new library to the recital which the attendees were very excited about. Reported progress on all other matters.

PUBLIC WORKS / BUILDING DEPARTMENT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Committee Chair Birdsall reported that the Public Works Superintendent, Mark Philpot, submitted a letter of resignation and the Borough is advertising for a new position of "working foreman." The Borough is also going to be advertising for summer maintenance jobs in the DPW. Councilman Birdsall thanked all DPW employees for the great job they did cleaning up after the storm. Councilman Birdsall provided an update on the street sweeping services that will be provided through the shared services agreement with Highlands as partial payment for life guarding services and updated Council on the streetscape project progress.

SEA BRIGHT RECOVERY/CAPITAL PLAN/FLOOD CONTROL/BEAUTIFICATION:

Committee Chair Kelly reported there was a community center pre-bid meeting last week for interested contractors. Beautification meeting was held to decide on pavers for the streetscape project and provided a recommendation - the contractor will need a decision from Council as to which pavers to use. Due to all the construction going on in town, the beautification plan for this summer will be to stay with just the seasonal planters/pots. The Committee reviewed the beautification master plan and their budget for this year and identified two areas to focus on - and budgeting for the future. Councilman Kelly reported council took a first step tonight regarding the municipal building by approving a resolution to go out to bid and hopes to be awarding the bid in late spring. Councilman Kelly also discussed beautifying the new bulkheads and utilizing the banners on the light posts in the municipal parking lot. Reported progress on all other matters.

MAYOR DINA LONG – Reports and Communications

Mayor Long made the following announcements:

- a resolution was approved this evening to participate in "Paint the Town Pink" and our liaison will be Elizabeth Homer.

- an event this Thursday at 6 pm, Two Rivers One Future, will be held at the Two River Theatre in Red Bank for anyone who is interested in flood control, regional planning and hazard mitigation in the future.

- Sea bright is presently engaged in two matters of litigation that are important for Sea Bright residents to be aware of: 1) litigation with the Shore Regional Board of Education with regard to the funding formula that resulted in the disproportionate share of the school budget. There is a scheduled hearing in May, but there will be discussions with the Shore Regional school board prior in hopes of coming up with a fair and reasonable formula; 2) seven Sea Bright beach clubs filed tax appeals for their reassessments. Five of the seven appeals are moving forward in a legal process. The Borough is holding their ground and feels confident in their position.

<u>REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE</u> (limited to 3 minutes)

Pam Ross, Peninsula Avenue, asked what transpired regarding the noise ordinance and how it is moving forward. Mayor Long responded that a draft ordinance was provided to Council but there are still a few outstanding questions that need answers. Mayor Long explained that there needs to be subjective and objective measures in defining what a nuisance is. Mayor Long said the governing body is committed to getting this done before the spring season and the outdoor noise becomes more pronounced - we are making a new law that will certainly go to court so we want to make sure it gets done right. Attorney McLaughlin commented and Councilman Birdsall explained that since he is new to Council the ordinance has been held up so he can get up to speed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilmember Leckstein offered a motion to enter into Closed Session; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meeting Act, NJSA 10:4-12 permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and
