No. 170-2017 Adopting the Monmouth County Multi-Jurisdictional Coastal Flood Evacuation Plan (CFEP) as Part of Borough of Sea Bright's Emergency Operations Plan

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution, seconded by Councilmember Rooney:

WHEREAS, Monmouth County remains highly vulnerable to flooding and susceptible to damage associated with coastal storm events; and

WHEREAS, some of the county's most densely populated areas and seasonally dependent businesses are located within 1- mile of the coast with densities in some places exceeding 5,000 people per square mile; and

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Management, with assistance from the Monmouth County Division of Planning and Manasquan Borough Office of Emergency Management, has developed a Multi-Jurisdictional Coastal Flood Evacuation Plan (CFEP) to improve response and coordination among local, state, and county agencies responsible for emergency operations involving floods; and

WHEREAS, the Multi-Jurisdictional Coastal Flood Evacuation Plan provides flood monitoring, warning, evacuation and response guidance for major coastal flood events resulting from both tropical cyclones and extra-tropical storm events such as nor'easters for Monmouth County and all of its affected municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the CFEP was developed using established National Weather Service Sea, Lake and Overland Surges from Hurricanes (SLOSH) model inundation areas in order to assist decision makers in determining appropriate evacuation strategies and proper allocation of high water response resources; and

WHEREAS, the multi-tiered evacuation zones presented in the CFEP are based on predicted storm surge events issued by the National Weather Service and are the basis for the "Know Your Zone" public education and awareness campaign to improve the storm readiness for residents, businesses, and visitors in Monmouth County; and

WHEREAS, municipalities that adopt the Multi-Jurisdictional Coastal Flood Evacuation Plan and participate in the National Flood Insurance Program's (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) program may be eligible for additional CRS credits in accordance Section 610, Flood Warning and Response, of the NFIP Community Rating System Coordinator's Manual; and

WHEREAS, municipalities that wish to earn additional credits towards CRS through adoption of the CFEP must develop their own individual Flood Warning & Response Plan, which at a minimum, must include all of the following action items:

- 1. Flood Threat Recognition (CRS 612.a): Municipal Coordinators/deputies must enroll in both iNWS and the Stevens Flood Advisory System;
- 2. Description of Local Flood Hazard (CRS 611.b): # structures, residences, buildings, critical facilities in each zone and local impacts if flooded;
- 3. Emergency Warning Dissemination (612.b): Activation of local warning systems based upon flood threat. Such warning may include pre-scripted messages, Reverse 911, Outdoor Siren System, Route Alerting (door-to-door) etc.:
- 4. Flood Response Operations (CRS 612.c): Local actions to be taken based upon flood threat. (ie: closing roads, relocating critical equipment to higher ground, open shelters/reception areas, etc.) as well a local person/Office/Department assigned to implement each action;
- 5. Critical Facilities Planning CRS 612.d): Critical Facilities must be identified in each zone, with contact information and a plan to notify them when appropriate; and

WHEREAS, in order to be eligible to received credits earned under CRS 610, municipalities must complete the following tasks:

- Pass a resolution adopting the Monmouth County CFEP and incorporate the Municipal Flood Warning & Response Plan into the Evacuation Annex of the municipal Emergency Operations Plan (EOP)
- Participate in an annual drill or exercise of the Flood Warning & Response Plan or
 participate in at least one an actual event during the year which results in activation
 of the Flood Warning & Response Plan
- Undertake one or more public Outreach Projects that address the local Flood Warning & Response Plan

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Borough Council of Borough of Sea Bright hereby supports adoption of the Monmouth County Multi-Jurisdictional Coastal Flood Evacuation Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough of Sea Bright develop and incorporate a Municipal Flood Warning & Response Plan into the Evacuation Annex of the municipal Emergency Operations Plan (EOP); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough of Sea Bright will support Monmouth County efforts with the "Know Your Zone" public education and awareness campaign.

No. 171-2017 Expressing Opposition to Legislative Proposals Regarding the Open Public Meetings Act and Open Public Records Act

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution, seconded by Councilmember Rooney:

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee took action on Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046, which amend the Open Public Meetings Act and Open Public Records Act, respectively, on June 29, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Committee released the bills to the full Senate without recommendation because the bills are unnecessary, unpopular with the public, and would result in significant financial and administrative burdens on municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the bills fail to adequately protect taxpayers, municipalities and, especially, municipal clerks from abusive, harassing, and purposefully confrontational individuals who submit voluminous requests for no legitimate reason; and

WHEREAS, the legislation would expand the Open Public Meeting Act to create impractical and burdensome requirements with respect to subcommittees and working groups established by the entire governing body, which would effectively limit the ability of small groups of local officials discussing issues of public concern for the purposes of informing the governing body; and

WHEREAS, under the bills, the responsibilities of municipal clerks, who the Legislature has already loaded with responsibilities beyond the scope of their office, would be stretched even further than current law requires without a single dollar of additional resources provided to, or authorized to be collected by, municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the bills would impose a financial burden on municipalities that would not be offset by a revenue source other than the property tax, making the bills unfunded mandates prohibited by the New Jersey Constitution; and

WHEREAS, some municipalities are more equipped than others to meet the burdens that would be imposed by Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046, however, without assistance of any kind from the States or the courts, every municipality would be on its own to meet the myriad new requirements of the law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that the Legislature is strongly urged to reject Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 and draft new legislation to modernize OPRA and OPMA while providing municipalities and clerks with the resources to effectuate these changes for the benefit of the public.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be filed with the legislative sponsors of Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 and Assembly Bill Nos. 2697 and 2699, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the President of the Senate, and the Governor, and all parties are urged to listen to the concerns of local officials and prevent Senate Bill Nos. 1045 and 1046 from becoming law.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

BEACH / GRANTS:

17-01231

Committee Chair Lamia reported there is a lot of activity happening on the beach with the seawall and beach pavilion projects underway and reminded residents and visitors to use caution near the work areas as it is unsafe. The Beach Committee will be meeting in the next two weeks to review the projects that are under way and how they might affect beach operations next spring and summer. Councilman Lamia said he is working with the Administration on some ideas to help the beach recover from recent storm erosion. Reported progress on all other matters.

FINANCE / INSURANCE / COURT / VOLUNTEERS:

10/12/2017

Committee Chair Keeler reported on an incident that was brought up at a recent JIF claims meeting involving a woman who tripped on a curb - one of the deciding factors in the settlement was how long the curb had been in that condition and whether or not borough employees should have seen it and reported it. Councilman Keeler reported the JIF has a new Best Practices brochure for police, fire and first aid which our Chief Sorrentino helped develop. Councilman Keeler added the safety focus in 2018 is going to be on equipment training. Reported progress on all other matters.

PERSONNEL/ PUBLIC RELATIONS / RECREATION:

Committee Chair Leckstein reported the "rocks for kindness" campaign seems to be taking off well in the Borough. Councilman Leckstein reported the Halloween festivities will be taking place on October 28 - Trunk or Treat at 4 pm and the First Aid Parade at 6 pm - followed by refreshments at the church. Councilman Leckstein reported the BSB is holding their annual fall festival at Eventide on November 11 - part of the proceeds will be donated to the library. Councilman Leckstein spoke about the crisis hotline for anyone that needs help - via text messaging - the number is 741741. Reported progress on all other matters.

PUBLIC SAFETY / EDUCATION/ LIBRARY:

Committee Chair Rooney reported the organ recital this past Saturday had a very good turnout and thanked Caputo's Bakery, Stroker's Deli and Richard's Deli for donating all the food. Councilman Rooney said people are getting really excited about the new library. Councilman Rooney reported progress on public safety. Councilman Rooney reported the education committee and Council continue to work very hard on the education situation.

PUBLIC WORKS / BUILDING DEPARTMENT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Committee Chair Birdsall reported public works has been very busy with all the projects going on in town. The NJDOT has been repairing a storm water drainage system on Ocean Avenue at the end of Surf Street which should be completed within the next day or two and then the DOT paving project will begin. Claire Petruzzella, T&M Engineer provided a schedule of the upcoming paving projects. Mayor Long asked Ms. Petruzzella to try to incorporate widening the stacking lane as you approach the Rumson bridge from the north into the new striping plan. Councilman Birdsall reported the bulkhead project on River Street is close to completion, a chain link fence was installed around 14 East New Street due to the condition of the building, and DPW began fall decorating in the borough. Councilman Birdsall reported we have 21 new building permits, 6 permit updates, one new building, one addition, one demo and 24 rehabs for a grand total of \$431,000 plus in total cost.

SEA BRIGHT RECOVERY/CAPITAL PLAN/FLOOD CONTROL/BEAUTIFICATION:

Committee Chair Kelly reported the beach pavilion construction is ongoing and is still on schedule and under budget. Councilman Kelly said the Borough received the final plans for the municipal building and they are under review by a review architect and department heads. Councilman Kelly provided an update on a meeting with the fire department to review the plans and said they are very comfortable with the new plans.

MAYOR DINA LONG – Reports and Communications

Mayor Long reported on a request from the last meeting to look into the draining issues on Island View Way - the Administrator and DPW went down there and we are waiting on a report back with what is causing the problem and possible solutions. Mayor Long said the five year anniversary of Super Storm Sandy is in two weeks and put into context what has been going on in Sea Bright over the last five years: Demolished properties: 69 residential, 8 commercial, 3 municipal; 92 houses were lifted, 10 are in progress; 38 new homes were constructed, 11 are in progress; 7 new commercial properties were completed and 3 new commercial properties are in progress. Mayor Long said Sea bright seems to be the poster child for risk when it comes to flooding and believes the reason we are on everyone's radar is because of the number of repetitive loss properties (when multiple insurance claims are put in on a property) in the Borough. Mayor Long said we have been working really hard to mitigate risks and lessen the number of repetitive loss properties; to date, we have requested 45 properties be removed from the list which is encouraging for the future of a more resilient Sea Bright. Mayor Long thanked all those that work for the Borough for their incredible team effort, the elected officials for volunteering so much of their time and our community for their tremendous team spirit.

EXECUTIVE SESSION
