No. 86-2018 Sustainable Land Use Pledge of the Borough of Sea Bright

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Birdsall:

WHEREAS, land use is an essential component of overall sustainability for a municipality; and

WHEREAS, poor land-use decisions can lead to and increase societal ills such as decreased mobility, high housing costs, increased greenhouse gas emissions, loss of open space and the degradation of natural resources; and

WHEREAS, well planned land use can create transportation choices, provide for a range of housing options, create walk-able communities, preserve open space, provide for adequate recreation, and allow for the continued protection and use of vital natural resources; and

WHEREAS, given New Jersey's strong tradition of home rule and local authority over planning and zoning, achieving a statewide sustainable land use pattern will require municipalities to take the lead; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, we, the Borough of Sea Bright, resolve to take the following steps with regard to our municipal land-use decisions with the intent of making the Borough of Sea Bright a truly sustainable community. It is our intent to include these principles in the next master plan revision and re-examination report and to update our land-use zoning, natural resource protection, and other ordinances accordingly.

Regional Cooperation: We pledge to reach out to administrations of our neighboring municipalities concerning land-use decisions, and to take into consideration regional impacts when making land-use decisions.

Transportation Choices: We pledge to create transportation choices with a Complete Streets approach by considering all modes of transportation, including walking, biking, transit and

automobiles, when planning transportation projects and reviewing development applications. We will reevaluate our parking with the goal of limiting the amount of required parking spaces, promoting shared parking and other innovative parking alternatives, and encouraging structured parking alternatives where appropriate.

Natural Resource Protection: We pledge to take action to protect the natural resources of the State and the Borough for environmental, recreational and agricultural value, avoiding or mitigating negative impacts to these resources. Further, we pledge to complete a Natural Resources Inventory when feasible to identify and assess the extent of our natural resources and to link natural resource management and protection to carrying capacity analysis, land-use and open space planning.

Mix of Land Uses: We pledge to use our zoning power to allow for a mix of residential, retail, commercial, recreational and other land use types in areas that make the most sense for our municipality and the region, particularly in downtown and borough center areas.

Housing Options: We pledge, through the use of our zoning and revenue generating powers, to foster a diverse mix of housing types and locations, including single and multi-family, for-sale and rental options, to meet the needs of all people at a range of income levels.

Green Design: We pledge to incorporate the principles of green design and renewable energy generation into municipal buildings to the extent feasible and when updating our site plan and subdivision requirements for residential and commercial buildings.

Municipal Facilities Siting: We pledge, to the extent feasible, to take into consideration factors such as walk-ability, bike-ability, greater access to public transit, proximity to other land-use types, and open space when locating new or relocated municipal facilities.

2018 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

PRESENTATION OF 2018 BUDGET: Michael Bascom, Chief Financial Officer CFO Michael Bascom made a presentation on the 2018 Municipal Budget which will be posted to the Borough website. The tax rate decreased 2.6% which is an approximate savings of \$9 for the average home in the Borough. The 2018 tax rate will be approximately 59.1 cents per \$100.00 of value as compared to 60.7 cents per \$100.00 in 2017. The general budget totals \$6,008,250.88 which reflects a return to pre-Sandy budgeting and a reduction of almost \$50,000.00 as compared to last year - if you were to take the 2012 budget 2% per year budget growth since Sandy, we are exactly where we would be had Sandy never happened. Mr. Bascom said that as a result of the Borough's conservative budgeting, the average tax on a home in Sea Bright remains more than \$1,000.00 below the County and State average.

Councilman Rooney reported Long Branch is awarding a lifeguard boat to our Ocean Rescue team.

FINANCE / INSURANCE / COURT / VOLUNTEERS:

Committee Chair Keeler thanked CFO Michael Bascom, Bob Alison and Borough staff for their hard work in regards to our budget and finance matters. Councilman Keeler gave a brief overview of the loss control report conducted by the JIF and announced that there is a safety meeting coming up if anyone wants to attend.

PERSONNEL/ PUBLIC RELATIONS / RECREATION:

Committee Chair Leckstein reported that there will be a town wide garage sale on May 5th. There is a \$5 fee to join which pays for a map of all of the participating properties. Reported progress on all other matters.

PUBLIC SAFETY / EDUCATION / LIBRARY:

Committee Chair Rooney reported that Chief Sorrentino finally got the NJDOT to approve the crosswalk at Via Ripa. Councilman Rooney reported we are continuing to move forward with the Shore Regional situation. Regarding the library, everyone is very excited and making preparations to move into our new library. There will be an organ recital at the Church on May 19th and afterward, all are invited to take a look at our new library in the new building. Reported progress on all other matters.

PUBLIC WORKS / BUILDING DEPARTMENT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Committee Chair Birdsall reported that DPW began to re-mulch and add rocks to our landscaping. The DPW met with State Fish and Wildlife representatives and were advised we have about 10 nests of piping plovers so far. Councilman Birdsall reported River Street was repaved on April 9th and T&M Associates has transferred full ownership of the Osborne Place pump station over to the Borough. The DPW staff has built ten new Beach lockers. Reported progress on all other matters.

MAYOR DINA LONG – Reports and Communications

Mayor Long announced that Sea Bright was officially accepted into the Community Rating System program at a ranking of "Class 6." This achievement will result in a 20% reduction of flood insurance rates for residents. This was a very tedious job and Borough staff as well as the Monmouth County Planning Board worked hard to get this done. Out of 105 communities in the CRS program only 17 are rated at a "Class 6" or better. Mayor Long remembered former Mayor, Maria Fernandez, as this was a project that she was passionate about.
