Melanie Lipinski, Principal (and newly appointed Superintendent) of the Wolf Hill School in Oceanport, attended the meeting to introduce herself to the Mayor, Council and members of the community. Vincent Lepore, 33 Ocean Terrace, Long Branch, NJ, directed questions to Attorney McLaughlin regarding the Gagliano appraisal of Block 21, Lot 5 dated January 24, 2018 and asked how the \$32,000.00 minimum bid came about on Resolution No. 78-2018 when the appraisal was \$16,000.00? Attorney McLaughlin responded that because there was more than one contiguous property owner interested in purchasing the property, Council agreed on the bid amount. Mr. Lepore asked why there were two letters sent to one of the contiguous property owners and who determined that the property was no longer needed for public use. Attorney McLaughlin and Mayor Long responded that it was a decision made by the Council. Mr. Lepore said he doesn't feel the Borough should be selling any property that could enhance public access to the beach or river and requested a "no" vote on this ordinance.

Mr. McLaughlin clarified for the record, that Mr. Lepore is a plaintiff in a lawsuit against the Borough challenging the vacation of a piece of property several years ago and is taking the case on appeal to the appellate division.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 5:

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 6:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses, and are capital improvements or properties that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the Improvements, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 5 years.

Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 8:

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 9:

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 10:

PUBLIC WORKS / BUILDING DEPARTMENT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Committee Member Leckstein reported progress in Committee Chair Birdsall's absence.

SEA BRIGHT RECOVERY/CAPITAL PLAN/FLOOD CONTROL/BEAUTIFICATION:

Committee Chair Kelly reported the municipal facility is progressing as planned. The beach pavilion still has quite a punch list to get through and we are hoping to get it completed soon. The pay parking revenue for the year is over \$200,000.00. Reported progress on all other matters.
