AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, REVISING CHAPTER 66, BEACHES, OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that Chapter 66, Beaches, shall be amended as follows:

SECTION ONE: Subparagraph F of Chapter 66, §66-22 "Controlled activities on supervised and unsupervised beaches" shall be amended as follows:

F. Beach fires, including the use of barbecues and grills for cooking, are prohibited on unsupervised beaches and are limited to specific occasions, times and designated areas on supervised beaches as permitted by supervisory personnel of supervised beaches or as permitted by a Special Event Permit obtained pursuant to Chapter 38 of the Borough Code provided said Special Event Permit has also been reviewed and approved by the Borough's Fire Marshall. Any permitted beach fires shall be subject to all applicable local, county, state and federal laws.

SECTION TWO: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION THREE: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication according to law.

BEACH / GRANTS:

No Report

FINANCE / INSURANCE / COURT / VOLUNTEERS:

Committee Chair Keeler reported that the JIF has been focusing on cyber security risk for municipalities. They have instituted a program where members of the JIF can get a special certification to lower their liability should a security breach happen. The cost of the program is based on the number of employees which would be approximately \$337 per year if we sign up for 3 years. As it could be quite costly to recover from a cyber attack, Council agreed we would benefit from this program. Councilman Keeler reported progress on all other matters and the budget process is underway for 2019.

Mayor Long added that we will be advertising for RFPs for professional services for 2019 and Council will be reviewing credentials.

PERSONNEL/ PUBLIC RELATIONS / RECREATION:

Committee Chair Leckstein reminded everyone that the annual Trunk or Treat will be this Saturday from 3pm - 4:30pm followed by the Sea Bright First Aid parade and costume contest. The 2018 Fall Festival sponsored by the Sea Bright Library will be Saturday November 3rd from 12pm-4pm and tickets can be purchase at Eventide. Mayor Long urged all to support these events.

PUBLIC WORKS / BUILDING DEPARTMENT/ CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Committee Chair Birdsall reported that the Department of Public Works staff has been doing fall cleaning around town, removed everything off of the beach, and removed the restroom trailers. Councilman Birdsall reported progress on all other matters.

MAYOR DINA LONG - Reports and Communications

Mayor Long noted that the next official regular Council meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 7, 2018 and the workshop will be held on November 1, 2018.

Mayor Long said that on this Election Day (November 6, 2018) it is very important that we have all hands on deck from Sea Bright to turn out to cast the vote for the Oceanport school board member. The number of Sea Bright voters is very low compared to Oceanport so there is a high likelihood we are going to lose representation on the school board.
