MINUTES REGULAR MEETING BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT

DECEMBER 18, 2018

SEA BRIGHT, NEW JERSEY

Mayor Long called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and requested those present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE</u> (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Linda Lamia, 2 Village Road, supports Councilman Leckstein in regards to our current municipal building being used in the future for the children of Sea Bright. She questioned if the trees from streetscape will be replaced. Administrator Verruni explained that we have a maintenance guarantee and they will be replaced in the spring. Ms. Lamia wished everyone a very happy Holiday.

Butch Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, said he thinks the walkway on the seawall is one of the best things that every happened in Sea Bright, however, there are stress cracks every 5-10 feet. Mr. Verruni said they are already looking into pricing to seal the cracks. Mr. Hentschel brought in pictures for Council of cracks in the parking lot as well - Mr. Verruni will look into this issue further.

Janet Hentschel, 7 East Church Street, questioned if we will be getting rid the port-o-pottys since the public bathrooms are now open. Mr. Verruni explained that the public bathrooms will be closed for the cold weather so we will be leaving 1 port-o-potty in place for now. Mrs. Hentschel wanted to know the status of the paving on Ocean Avenue. Engineer Claire Petruzzella explained that the NJDOT full paving overlay and re-striping project will take place in 2022. Councilman Birdsall stated that by that time all of the paving on the side streets will be finished. Ms. Hentschel also mentioned the ponding at the street corners and hopes that will be addresses. Ms. Hentschel said she was offended that a Councilperson referred to her as a "complainer" when she brought up business parking issues and said it was very unprofessional.

Councilman Rooney explained that he carries a broom in his van to sweep away the puddles on Ocean Avenue and feels it is something that seriously needs to be addressed. Mayor Long thought that the bump outs from the streetscape were supposed to alleviate this issue. The Engineers will look into this problem.

No. 173-2018 Adopting Guidelines for Random Drug Screening of Law Enforcement

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Kelly:

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Attorney General has promulgated a series of comprehensive directives and guidelines, binding on local law enforcement agencies, identifying the types of drug testing that local law enforcement agencies are required to conduct, (testing of applicants, trainees and sworn regular and special officers currently employed), the procedures required to be utilized in conducting drug testing, and the required employment consequences of producing a positive drug test result or refusing to participate in drug testing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Attorney General Law Enforcement Directive No. 2018-2, promulgated on March 20, 2018, it is now mandatory for local law enforcement agencies to conduct random drug testing on no less than 10% of the agency's sworn regular and special officers once in 2018, and twice per year for every calendar year thereafter; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2018, the Sea Bright Police Department added a policy in the Sea Bright Police Department Standard Operating Procedures to conduct drug testing of sworn law enforcement officers, law enforcement officer trainees, and applicants for law enforcement office employment in accordance with the New Jersey Attorney General's directives and guidelines and the applicable directives of the Monmouth County Prosecutor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. "The Sea Bright Police Department shall conduct random drug and alcohol testing of sworn regular and special police officers, applicants and trainees in accordance with all duly adopted directives and guidelines issued by the New Jersey Attorney General, the applicable directives of the Monmouth County Prosecutor, and the duly-adopted rules, regulations, policies and standard operating procedures of the Sea Bright Police Department, along with any subsequent amendments, modifications and supplements thereto. In case of any conflict between the terms of the directives/guidelines of the New Jersey Attorney General/Monmouth County Prosecutor and the rules, regulations, policies and standard operating procedures of the Sea Bright Police Department, the directives/guidelines of the New Jersey Attorney General and applicable directives of the Monmouth County Prosecutor shall control."

2. All ordinances or resolutions in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby repealed.

3. In case, for any reason, any section or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect any other section or provision of this Resolution, except so far as the section or provision so declared unconstitutional or invalid shall be severed from the remainder of this Resolution.
