Increase Special Duty Assignments Rates for Police Officers Chapter 39 "Police Department" Article III Special Duty Assignments

WHEREAS, Chapter 39 of the General Code of the Borough of Sea Bright entitled Police Department, Article III, Special Duty Assignments that requires the charges for such service be set forth annually in a resolution adopted by the governing body, and

WHEREAS, various businesses working within the Borough of Sea Bright from time to time make requests for assistance from members of the municipal police department to perform special duty assignment services; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the interest of safety that personnel specially trained to undertake these activities be used in the performance of these duties; and

WHEREAS, work performed is to be considered a "special duty assignment from independent contractors" and as such is exempt from Fair Labor Standards Act; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended that the hourly rates (minimum of four (4) hours) be increased \$15.00 per hour (from \$70.00 to \$85.00) as follows:

APPROVING THE FORM AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A LETTER OF REPRESENTATION AND A CONTINUING DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF THE MONMOUTH COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY'S CAPITAL EQUIPMENT POOLED LEASE REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2019 AND AUTHORIZING AN AUTHORIZED MUNICIPAL REPRESENTATIVE TO DO ALL OTHER THINGS DEEMED NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SUCH BONDS

WHEREAS, the Shore Regional School District (the "Board") desires to lease and permanently finance the cost of acquisition of certain capital equipment (the "Equipment") from The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority will provide for the financing of the cost of the acquisition of the Equipment by the issuance of its Capital Equipment Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Shore Regional School District Project) (the "Bonds") payable from rentals by the Board pursuant to a Lease and Agreement by and between the Board and the Authority (the "Lease"); and

WHEREAS, in order to induce the Authority to issue and deliver the Bonds and its Capital Equipment Pooled Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2019, there has been prepared and submitted to the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey (the "Municipality") a Letter of Representation in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, there has been prepared and submitted to the Municipality a Continuing Disclosure Agreement in the form appended hereto as Exhibit B for execution by the Municipality if the Authority shall determine that the Municipality is or will be an "obligated person" with respect to the Authority's Capital Equipment Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (an "Obligated Person");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. That the Letter of Representation, in the form presented to this meeting, be and the same is hereby approved, and any Authorized Municipal Representative (as that term is defined in the Lease) is hereby authorized to, and one of such officers shall execute the Letter of Representation, with such additions, deletions or modifications as such officer shall approve, and to deliver the same to the addressees designated on such Letter of Representation, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.
- Section 2. That the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, in the form presented to this meeting, be and the same is hereby approved, and any Authorized Municipal Representative is hereby authorized to, and one of such officers shall execute the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, with such additions, deletions or modifications as such officer shall approve, and to deliver the same upon the determination by the Authority that the Municipality is or will be an Obligated Person, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

- Section 3. That any Authorized Municipal Representative is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out the sale, issuance and delivery of the Bonds, the Authority's Capital Equipment Pooled Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 and all related transactions contemplated by this resolution.
- Section 4. All resolutions or proceedings, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright desires to participate in a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with the National Park Service, United States Department of Interior, Sandy Hook Unit setting forth the terms and conditions under which both parties will provide mutual assistance in preventing, detecting and suppressing structural fires and wildfires on lands within the Park's boundaries, within the Borough of Sea Bright and in the immediate surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have been identified as eligible jurisdictions to enter into a reciprocal mutual aid agreement with another fire organization which maintains fire protection facilities in their vicinity, for mutual aid in furnishing fire protection for such property and for other property for which such organization normally provides fire protection; and

WHEREAS, said agreement is beneficial to both parties as it establishes a formal agreement which can be utilized for fire prevention and suppression, grant and training opportunities; and

WHEREAS, said agreement will be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of final signature.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey hereby authorize the Mayor and Borough Clerk to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the National Park Service, United States Department of Interior, Sandy Hook Unit for the purposes stated herein according to the terms and conditions in the attached mutual aid MOU; and

Memorandum of Understanding between the National Park Service and the Borough of Sea Bright, NJ

Article I - Background and Objectives

This agreement is entered into by and between the National Park Service (hereinafter "NPS"), United States Department of the Interior, acting through the Superintendent of Gateway National Recreation Area, Sandy Hook Unit (hereinafter "Park"), New Jersey, and the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey, acting through its Mayor. The purpose of this agreement is to establish the terms and conditions under which the parties will provide mutual assistance in preventing, detecting, and suppressing structural fires and wildfires on lands within the Park's boundaries, within the Borough of Sea Bright, and in the immediate surrounding area.

Currently the NPS is primarily responsible for providing fire prevention, detection, and suppression on federally owned land within the Park. The Sea Bright Fire Department is primarily responsible for providing fire prevention, detection, and suppression within the Borough of Sea Bright.

Article II - Authority

The NPS enters into this agreement under the authority of 42 U.S.C. § 1856a (2006), which authorizes "[e]ach [federal] agency head charged with the duty of providing fire protection for any property of the United States . . . to enter into a reciprocal agreement, with any fire organization maintaining fire protection facilities in the vicinity of such property, for mutual aid in furnishing fire protection for such property and for other property for which such organization normally provides fire protection."

Article III - Statement of Work

A. The NPS agrees to:

- 1. Furnish, when requested by the Sea Bright Fire Department, qualified NPS employees to assist in the suppression of structural fires and wildfires within the Borough of Sea Bright or in the immediate surrounding area whenever the furnishing of such assistance does not seriously impact the conduct of Park business. Qualified NPS employees shall be deemed to be acting within the scope of their federal employment when responding to calls from the fire department.
- 2. Provide to the Sea Bright Fire Department an annual familiarization tour of the Park's facilities, equipment, and access points.
- 3. Provide to the Sea Bright Fire Department access to radio channels for direct communication with on-duty Emergency Services Personnel during an incident/emergency.

B. The Borough of Sea Bright agrees to:

- 1. Furnish, when requested by the NPS, available qualified personnel, fire equipment, and rescue equipment to assist in the suppression of structural fires and wildfires on federally owned land within the Park.
- 2. Provide to the NPS an annual familiarization tour of the Sea Bright Fire Department's facilities and equipment.

C. The parties further agree as follows:

- 1. Each party will provide to the other party a list of responsible persons, with telephone numbers, to be contacted in an emergency. At least once a year, or more often if necessary, each party will provide the other party with an updated list of such persons and telephone numbers.
- 2. Each party will provide to the other party copies of current fire management plans for their areas of primary responsibility, including maps of areas involved and descriptions of special or extraordinary actions to be taken.
- 3. After notifying the other party of a fire's discovery, either party may take immediate action to suppress a fire in the other party's area of primary responsibility in order to save life or property.
- 4. After both parties have personnel on site, the party that normally would respond to the fire will assume control of the scene and will direct the fire suppression efforts; provided that the directing party will direct the efforts of employees of the assisting party only through the highest-ranking employee of the assisting party at the scene, which individual will be identified by the assisting party.
- 5. During the performance of this agreement employees of each party will remain under the control of, and report to, their normal supervisors through their normal chain of command. Employees of one party should not be deemed to be "borrowed servants" of the other party.
- 6. Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics must be used when fighting fires on federally owned land within the Park. Minimal damage must be done to historic park structures during fire suppression activities. No chainsaws or ground-disturbing equipment such as graders or bulldozers may be used without the permission of the NPS Superintendent or his/her designee during wildfire suppression.
- 7. In accordance with 42 U.S.C. § 1856a(a), each party to this agreement waives all claims against the other party for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring in consequence of the performance of this agreement.
- 8. Neither party to this agreement will reimburse the other party for all or any part of the cost incurred by such party in providing fire protection pursuant to this agreement.
- 9. Nothing in this agreement will be construed as obligating the NPS to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of the monies appropriated by Congress or allocated by the NPS for the performance of this agreement.

Article IV - Term of Agreement

This agreement will be effective for a period of five years from the date of final signature, unless it is terminated earlier by one of the parties pursuant to article VIII below. At the conclusion of that five-year term, this agreement may be extended or renewed by written agreement of the parties.

Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties, any property furnished by one party to the other will remain the property of the furnishing party. Any property furnished by the NPS to the Borough of Sea Bright during the performance of this agreement will be used and disposed of as set forth in the NPS Property Management Regulations.

Article VI - Prior Approval

Not applicable.

Article VII - Reports and/or Deliverables

Upon request and to the full extent permitted by applicable law, the parties will share with each other final reports of incidents involving both parties.

Article VIII - Modification and Termination of Agreement

This agreement may be modified only by a written instrument executed by the parties.

Either party may terminate this agreement by providing the other party with sixty (60) days advance written notice. In the event that one party provides the other party with notice of its intention to terminate, the parties shall meet promptly to discuss the reasons for the notice and to try to resolve their differences amicably. The parties commit to using every reasonable means available, including the use of a neutral mediator if necessary, to try to avoid terminating this agreement.

Article IX - Standard Clauses

A. Civil Rights

During the performance of this agreement, the participants agree to abide by the terms of USDI-Civil Rights Assurance Certification, non-discrimination, and will not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The participants will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

B. Officials Not to Benefit

No member of or delegate to Congress or resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this agreement if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

C. Public Information Release

The Borough of Sea Bright must obtain prior Government approval from the Superintendent of Gateway National Recreation Area for any public information release that refers to the Department of the Interior, any bureau, park unit, or employee (by name or title), or to this agreement. The specific text, layout, photographs, etc. of the proposed release must be submitted with the request for approval.

ORDINANCE NO. 17-2019

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE GUARANTY BY THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, NEW JERSEY OR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON THE CAPITAL EQUIPMENT LEASE REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2019 (SHORE REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT PROJECT) OF THE MONMOUTH COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Pursuant to Section 80 of the County Improvement Authorities Law, Section 1. N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 et. seq., the Borough of Sea Bright, New Jersey (the "Municipality") is hereby authorized to unconditionally and irrevocably guaranty the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the Capital Equipment Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Shore Regional School District Project) (the "Bonds") of The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") Outstanding (as that term is defined in the following described resolution) under the resolution of the Authority entitled "Capital Equipment Lease Revenue Bond Resolution (Shore Regional School District Project)" (the "Bond Resolution") to be adopted in a form approved by counsel to the Municipality. The Authority plans to issue the Bonds to finance the acquisition and subsequent leasing of certain capital equipment to the Shore Regional School District (the "Board") pursuant to a lease and agreement to be entered into by the Authority and the Board (the "Lease"). Such guaranty shall be given in accordance with the guaranty agreement (the "Guaranty Agreement") between the Municipality and the Authority in substantially the form submitted to this Board, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of the Municipality, with such changes as may be approved by counsel to the Municipality. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Guaranty Agreement on behalf of the Municipality in substantially such form as submitted hereto and with such changes as may be approved by the Mayor, and the Clerk of the Municipality is hereby authorized to attest such signature affixing the seal of the Municipality. All representatives, officials and employees of the Municipality are hereby authorized to enforce and to implement the Guaranty Agreement.

Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and state:

- (1) The maximum principal amount of the Bonds of the Authority hereby and hereunder to be guaranteed as to payment of principal and interest shall not exceed the sum of the amount necessary to acquire the Board's equipment as set forth in Schedule A which will be subject to the Lease and to pay the Board's share of the costs of issuance, but in no event shall such principal amount exceed \$330,000, of which the Municipality will guarantee 19.594% or not to exceed \$64,662.
- (2) The Bonds shall mature within eleven years of the date of issue.
- (3) The Bonds shall remain Outstanding to their respective stated maturity dates and the guaranty authorized herein shall remain effective until all Bonds shall have been paid in full in accordance with their terms notwithstanding the occurrence of any other event.

- The guaranty authorized herein may be made and this ordinance may be (4)adopted notwithstanding any statutory debt or other limitations, including particularly any limitation or requirement under or pursuant to the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1, et. seq., but the principal amount of any Outstanding Bonds shall be included after their issuance in the gross debt of the Municipality for the purpose of determining the indebtedness of the Municipality under or pursuant to the Local Bond The principal amount of the Bonds included in the gross debt of the Municipality shall be deducted from the gross debt of the Municipality under and all for all the purposes of the Local Bond Law (a) from and after the time of issuance of the Bonds until the end of the fiscal year beginning next after the acquisition of the equipment to be financed from the proceeds of the Bonds and (b) in any Annual Debt Statement filed pursuant to the Local Bond law as of the end of such fiscal year or any subsequent fiscal year if the revenues or other receipts or moneys of the Authority in such year are sufficient to pay its expenses of operation and maintenance in such year and all amounts payable in such year on account of the principal of and the interest on all such Bonds, all bonds of the Municipality issued as provided under N.J.S.A. 40:37A-79 and all bonds of the Authority issued under the County Improvement Authorities Law.
- Section 3. Upon payment of the principal of and the interest due on the Bonds by the Authority or by the defeasance of the Bonds pursuant to the Bond Resolution, the guaranty authorized herein will cease to exist and the gross debt of the Municipality shall be reduced to the extent that such Bonds cease to be Outstanding under the Bond Resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption in accordance with the County Improvement Authorities Law and the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-2019

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 130, "LAND USE," ARTICLE XVII, "AFFORDABLE HOUSING REGULATIONS," SECTIONS 130-121B AND 130-123 PERTAINING TO THE CALCULATION AND COLLECTION OF DEVELOPMENT FEES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION ONE:

The Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Chapter 130, "Land Use," Article XVII, "Affordable Housing Regulations," Section 130-121, "Residential Development Fees," Subsection 130-121B, "Eligible Exactions, Ineligible Exactions and Exemptions for Residential Developments," be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

(strikethroughs are deletions; bolded are additions)

"B. Eligible Exactions, Ineligible Exactions and Exemptions for Residential Developments.

- (1) Affordable housing developments, developments where the developer is providing for the construction of affordable units elsewhere in the municipality, and developments where the developer has made a payment in lieu of on-site construction of affordable units shall be exempt from development fees.
- (2) Developments that have received preliminary or final site plan approval prior to the adoption of a municipal development fee ordinance shall be exempt from development fees, unless the developer seeks a substantial change in the approval. Where a site plan approval does not apply, a zoning and/or building permit shall be synonymous with preliminary or final site plan approval for this purpose. The fee percentage shall be vested on the date that the building permit is issued.
- (3) Owner-occupied residential structures demolished and replaced as a result of a fire, flood, or natural disaster shall be exempt from paying a development fee.
- (4) Development fees shall be imposed and collected when an existing structure undergoes a change to a more intense use, is demolished and replaced or is where the square footage is expanded by 51% (fifty-one percent) or more, if the expansion is not otherwise exempt from the development fee requirement. The development fee shall be calculated on the increase in the equalized assessed value of the improved structure.
 - (5) Where there is an improvement, to, expansion of, reconstruction or

replacement of an existing residential structure, requiring a Construction Permit, no development fee shall be required to be paid. The construction or improvement of a permitted accessory structure on a lot containing an existing residential structure shall not require the payment of a development fee.

(6) Developers of houses of worship and other uses that are entitled to exemption from New Jersey real property tax shall be exempt from the payment of a development fee, provided that such development does not result in the construction of any additional housing or residential units, including assisted living and continuing care retirement communities."

SECTION TWO:

The Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, Chapter 130, "Land Use," Article XVII, "Affordable Housing Regulations," Section 130-123, "Collection Procedures," be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to read, in full, as follows:

"§130-123. Collection Procedures.

- (1) Upon the granting of a preliminary, final or other applicable approval for a development, the approving authority or entity shall notify or direct its staff to notify the Construction Official response for the issuance of a Construction Permit.
- (2) For non-residential developments only, the developer shall also be provided with a copy of form N-RDF "State of New Jersey Non-Residential Development Certification/Exemption" to be completed as per the instructions provided. The developer of a non-residential development shall complete N-RDF as per the instructions provided. The Construction Official shall verify the information submitted by the non-residential developer as per the instructions provided in the Form N-RDF. The Tax Assessor shall verify exemptions and prepare estimated and final assessments as per the instructions provided in Form N-RDF.
- (3) The Construction Official responsible for the issuance of a Construction Permit shall notify the Borough Tax Assessor of the issuance of the first Construction Permit for a development which is subject to a development fee.
- (4) Within 90 days of the receipt of such notification, the Borough Tax Assessor shall prepare an estimate of the equalized assessed value of the development based on the plans filed, which shall be provided to the developer.
- (5) The Construction Official responsible for the issuance of a final Certificate of Occupancy shall notify the Borough Tax Assessor of any and all requests for the scheduling of a final inspection on a property which is subject to a development fee.

- (6) Within 10 business days of a request for the scheduling of a final inspection, the Borough Tax Assessor shall confirm or modify the previously estimated equalized assessed value of the improvements associated with the development; calculate the development fee; and thereafter notify the developer of the amount of the fee.
- (7) Should the Borough of Sea Bright fail to determine or notify the developer of the amount of the development fee within 10 business days of the request for final inspection, the developer may estimate the amount due and pay the estimated amount consistent with the dispute process set forth in Subsection b. of Section 37 of P.L. 2008, c.46 (C.40:55D-8.6)
- (8) Except as provided in Section 130-122 A.(3) hereinabove, fifty percent (50%) of the initially calculated development fee shall be collected at the time of the issuance of the Construction Permit. The remaining portion shall The entire development fee shall be collected at the time of issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy. No Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued until the development fee is paid in full."

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION FOUR: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law and upon filing with the Monmouth County Planning Board.
