WHEREAS, the Police Chief will coordinate the effort on behalf of the Borough in all aspects of public safety and work closely with the Borough's Fire Marshall and the Beach manager to insure compliance with all fire safety regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board, upon giving due notice to the owners of the aforesaid properties, conducted a public hearing on this study on April 25, 2017, at which time Ms. Cofone provided detailed testimony and all persons having an interest in said application were given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, following the conclusion of that portion of the hearing, the Planning Board voted to find that the properties in question as set forth in the aforesaid study met one or more of the statutory criteria in order to be designated as a condemnation area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has had the opportunity to review the aforesaid Report and the subsequent Resolution adopted by the Planning Board memorializing its findings;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright that it hereby adopts the findings of the Borough Planning Board and the contents of the aforesaid Condemnation Redevelopment Investigation Report prepared by Cofone Consulting Group dated April, 2017; and

No. 104-2019 Expressing Support for Legislation Increasing State Funding to the "Shore Protection Fund" From \$25 Million To \$50 Million

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey maintains the Shore Protection Fund, which was established in 1992; and

WHEREAS, the Shore Protection Fund provides important funding that allows the State and municipalities to engage in cost-share partnerships with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on shore protection projects including beach restoration and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Shore Protection Fund is funded by State realty transfer fee revenue, and is currently capped at \$25 million, an amount that was last adjusted in 1999; and

WHEREAS, following the devastating effects of Superstorm Sandy, it has become evident that the current funding to the Shore Protection Fund is inadequate for allowing the State and municipalities to fund necessary projects; and

WHEREAS, pending before the Legislature are bills S-1614 and A-826, which would increase the cap on funding to the Shore Protection Fund to \$50 million; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council believes this proposed increase to the Shore Protection Fund is essential to protecting the shoreline of the Borough of Sea Bright and that of every other shore community comprising the Jersey Shore.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that it hereby expresses its support for an increase in funding to the Shore Protection Fund from \$25 million to \$50 million, as provided in the bills pending before the Legislature as S-1614 and A-826.
