Irwin Bieber, 12 Tradewinds Lane, questioned if the town has heard anything back from the DEP on the town's objection to the CAFRA permit for Edgewater Beach Club. Mr. Verruni said he has not heard anything and stated most of their coastal enforcement employees have been furloughed due to COVID19 – Attorney McLaughlin stated that he has not heard anything either and is not sure what the status is at the moment. Mr. Bieber hopes that the town will continue to stay focused on the objections stated in their letter. Mr. Bieber also had questions regarding Ordinance 08-2020 and asked what are the values of the stipends and will there be any supplementary costs? Councilman Rooney stated the stipend for the Mayor will be \$3,000 and \$2,500 for the councilmembers. No one on the current council will receive the stipend – it would only be for newly elected officials. Councilman Rooney does not believe there will be any supplementary costs.

**SECTION ONE:** Chapter 3, "Administrative Code," of the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented to add thereto the following section:

#### "§3-14. STIPENDS FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS.

- **A.** Annual stipends for the Mayor; Council President and other members of the Borough Council shall be established in the salary ordinance and shall be set by resolution of the Borough Council.
- **B.** This section shall apply only to those officials of the Borough elected to terms commencing on or after January 1, 2021 or appointed to fill vacancies thereafter."

**SECTION TWO**: All Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

**SECTION THREE**: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

**SECTION FOUR:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

# <u>PUBLIC HEARING: Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant Program</u> Project Scope Summary for Grant Application to The Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant Program to Provide Funding for Phase II Development of "Shrewsbury Riverfront Park" Block 24, Lots 1, 1.01 and 1.02 - 960 Ocean Avenue

Frank Lawrence, Administrative Assistant of Special Projects, distributed plans and provided a project scope summary. Mr. Lawrence explained that this grant application will provide funding for Phase II of the "Shrewsbury Riverfront Park" development project. There have been no significant changes to the plans since they were originally presented to Council and the community. The only added improvement was a fence along Ocean Avenue per the recommendation from our Risk Manager and the JIF to provide additional safety along Rt. 36. Mr. Lawrence said Phase II is estimated to cost \$160,000 - \$80,000 of which the Borough will be responsible for as the matching portion which the Monmouth County Conservation Foundation has been working to raise the majority of those funds. Administrator Verruni explained that Phase II would include plantings, the pavilion structure, the irrigation system, and electrical service. Mr. Verruni made it clear that if the matching funds are not raised, the Borough would have to do a capital improvement bond to pay for the balance.

Irwin Bieber, 12 Tradewinds Lane, thanked the team involved in this project and said the drawing that was sent out in advance of the meeting was absolutely beautiful and is very proud of everything the town is doing. Mr. Bieber questioned if we anticipate any problems with the bridge construction that is adjacent to the park. Mr. Lawrence stated that the bridge construction will not impact the park until they are demolishing the current bridge which is several years out. At the time of the demolition, they will be utilizing about 1/3 of the park for staging but are required to return the park to the state they had found it. We will have about 6 months of disruption but will ultimately benefit from the construction since they will also be required to improve the bulkhead in that area.

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the Borough of Sea Bright desires to obtain County Open Space Trust Funds in the amount of \$80,000.00 to fund Phase II of Development of the Shrewsbury Riverfront Park, 960 Ocean Avenue, Block 24, Lots 1, 1.01 and 1.02; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the project including all matching funds is \$160,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey, Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Parks and Forestry is the owner of and the Borough of Sea Bright controls the project site.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth that:

Christine Pfeiffer, Borough Clerk or her successor is authorized to (a) make an application to the County of Monmouth for Open Space Trust Funds, (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required for the Municipal Open Space Grants Program and (c) act as the municipal contact person and correspondent of the above named municipality; and
- 2. The Borough of Sea Bright is committed to this project and will provide the balance of funding necessary to complete the project as described in the grant application in the form of non-county matching funds as required in the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Program; and
- 3. If the County of Monmouth determines that the application is complete and in conformance with the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program and the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Municipal Grants Program adopted thereto, the municipality is willing to use the approved Open Space Trust Funds in accordance with such policies and procedures, and applicable federal, state, and local government rules, regulations and statutes thereto; and
- 4. Mayor Brian P. Kelly or his successor is hereby authorized to sign and execute any required documents, agreements, and amendments thereto with the County of Monmouth for the approved Open Space Trust Funds; and
- 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
