Mayor Kelly called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and requested those present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Kelly read the following Compliance Statement:

REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Chris Doxey, 9 Church Street, questioned the building height of 42 ft for structures in the proposed redevelopment plan. Borough Planner, Christine Cofone, explained that the height is calculated from Sea Bright's definition of building height in the code. She also clarified that tonight is only the introduction of the Ordinance – it will then go to the Planning Board for further review.

Natalie Nicol, 16 New Street, questioned why we aren't using the post sandy height of 38ft for this development. Borough Planner, Christine Cofone, explained that this is a redevelopment area and we are trying to encourage development. She does not believe that the height is out of character and the developer feels he needs that height to deliver high-end product with elevators in each unit.

Drew Miller, 16 Church Street, expressed his concerns about the 42ft building height. He is in favor of the redevelopment with a 38 ft. cap. height of the structures. Mr. Miller addressed the condition of the basketball court in the municipal parking lot - it is unlevel and not done properly. Mr. Miller said we need to provide a healthy and safe alternative to video games for our children and it is critical and essential that we provide fresh air and organized sport like basketball. Mr. Miller would like to see the court redone properly. Mayor Kelly stated that a reason that we are reclaiming the old borough hall is to provide additional space for the children of Sea Bright to hold sporting and other activities. Councilman Birdsall will look into seeing what we can do about the unlevel pavement. Administrator Verruni stated that the Department of Public Works is ordering the hoops and noted the court was not built to be an official court – it was intended for kids to shoot hoops. Mr. Miller encouraged every Councilmember to take a look at the basketball court. Councilman Rooney suggested installing lights on the side of the beach pavilion so the court can be used at night and recommended not ordering of hoops until we figure out a better plan.

Dina Long, 20 New Street, wanted to make a factual correction to the discussion regarding the Sea Bright zoning standards. Ms. Long read chapter 130-50A6(c) in the code stating "In no case shall the maximum allowable height exceed 38ft in building height". She expressed her concerns about the bulk use standards that Council is about to introduce. Ms Long said she understands the tremendous public benefit of the plan, however, the tradeoff for the residents in the neighborhood is extreme. As a matter of principal she believes that everyone should have to follow the same rules. Ms. Long is respectfully requesting that the bulk use standards be revisited to make them consistent with the other single-family homes in Sea Bright.

Joe Dolce, 41 Waterview Way, stated he is a new resident of Sea Bright and is concerned about all the cars that come down his street when turning around for Sandy Hook. The street is a dead-end with no outlet and cars have to make u-turns to get out - a telephone pole and fire hydrant within close proximity have been hit a few times. Mr. Dolce asked if the Borough can install signage that would indicate there is no outlet which might deter the cars from turning down the street. Councilman Birdsall will speak with Public Works to see what we can do.

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2019 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk of the Borough of Sea Bright pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and,

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, at a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "**COMMENTS and RECOMMENDATIONS"**; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "**COMMENTS and RECOMMENDATIONS**" as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and,

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that all conditions of the December 13, 2017 Grant Agreement have been satisfied by the Borough of Sea Bright and that Phase I of the project has been completed; and

No. 175-2020 RESCINDING REDEVELOPMENT ZONE AND REDEVELOPER DESIGNATIONS FOR LOTS 2, 3, AND 4 IN BLOCK 15

Councilmember Leckstein introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Birdsall:

WHEREAS, the area known as the Downtown Properties Redevelopment Area, Block 15, Lots 2, 3 and 4 on the Sea Bright Tax Map was deemed to be an area in need of redevelopment by the Borough Council in Resolution 135-2016, adopted on November 14, 2016, pursuant to a report prepared by Cofone Consulting Group, LLC, entitled "Condemnation Redevelopment Investigation – Downtown Properties"; and

WHEREAS, on February 4, 2020, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright ("Borough") adopted a Resolution designating The Break at Sea Bright, LLC as the redeveloper of Block 15, Lots 2, 3 and 4, collectively the ("Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2020, the redeveloper notified the Borough in writing that it no longer wanted to be the developer of the Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, on August 19, 2020, the redeveloper notified that Borough in writing that it only wanted to develop Block 15, Lot 3, which is a portion of the Redevelopment Area that it owns and that it will prepare for its Planning Board presentation; and

WHEREAS, based on the decision made by the Redeveloper, it is no longer practical to develop the lots that constitute the Redevelopment Area on a unified basis by a single redeveloper; and

WHEREAS, it is more practical for the current owners of the lots that comprise the Redevelopment Area to individually develop their respective properties; and

WHEREAS, based on those practical considerations, it is in the best interests of the Borough to rescind the redeveloper status of The Break at Sea Bright, LLC; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Borough to rescind the Redevelopment Area designation of Block 15, Lots 2, 3 and 4; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1) The designation and status of The Break at Sea Bright, LLC as the Redeveloper of Block 15, Lots 2, 3 and 4 be and the same is hereby rescinded.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMITTEE COMMENTS

Mayor Kelly reminded the public that they should have received their ballot for the General Election - there is information on the Borough website if anyone has questions about returning their ballot. The State Department of Health released Halloween guidelines which are also on our website. Mayor Kelly spoke with our consultant for the cell tower and they have received the necessary permits to construct the permanent cell tower with the additional carrier. Once it is completed the temporary tower will be removed. The beach season has now ended and it turned out to be very successful considering – parking revenue received was around \$650,000 and beach revenue was approximately \$1,021,000.

Councilman Schwartz stated that we had a record year at the beach and we should be very proud of our Beach Manager, Don Klein, and all the beach employees. Councilman Schwartz said he spoke with CFO Michael Bascom about closing out our inter-funds at the end of the year.

Chris Doxey, 9 Church Street, questioned if we will be having the Halloween parade this year. Councilman Leckstein explained that he spoke with Don Klein and he is trying very hard to make the parade happen in a safe way, but it has not been officially announced yet.
