RESOLUTION NO. 66-2023 AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLANDS 2023 OCEAN RESCUE LIFEGUARD SERVICES

Councilmember Booker introduced and offered for adoption the following Resolution; seconded by Councilmember Bieber:

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et. seq. authorizes the approval of Shared Services Agreements between local units by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Bright ("Sea Bright") and the Borough of Highlands ("Highlands") wish to enter into a Shared Services Agreement for the provision of lifeguard services by Sea Bright to Highlands for the 2023 summer season; and

WHEREAS, Sea Bright and Highlands agree that Sea Bright is to provide lifeguard services to Highlands for the period of June 17, 2023 through and including September 4, 2023 as per the terms of the attached Agreement for an amount of \$55,628.00; and

WHEREAS, Sea Bright and Highlands previously agreed that Highlands will perform street sweeping services for Sea Bright at a cost of \$15,000.00 which was authorized by way of Resolution No. 53-2023; and

WHEREAS, per the terms of the agreement, Sea Bright will apply a credit of \$15,000.00 towards the cost of lifeguard operations, wherein Highlands will pay Sea Bright the total amount of \$40,628.00 for lifeguard services; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge and agree that they are associated for only the purposes set forth in the Agreement and any other duly ratified Shared Services Agreement between them, and that each is a public entity separate and distinct from the other.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that the Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Shared Services Agreement to provide lifeguard services to the Borough of Highlands for the 2023 summer season for a fee of \$55,628.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the net amount paid by Highlands to Sea Bright will be \$40,628.00 as referenced above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution and a copy of the attached Agreement be forwarded to the following:

Re: Highlands Lifeguard/River Rescue Program Summer 2023

Sea Bright Ocean Rescue is a nationally certified ocean rescue agency. Currently SBOR is a USLA certified agency and holds a concurrent lifeguard program certification by the North Shore Lifesaving Association Monmouth County, NJ. Sea Bright Ocean Rescue is one of only a hand full of NATIONAL USLA certified agencies in New Jersey with a Surf Rescue Team that holds its own USLA certification as an Aquatic Response Rescue Team. SBOR was also recently awarded a Personal Rescue Watercraft certification by the USLA. SBOR is certified by the state of NJ as an ocean & tidal water beach lifeguard service under NJAC 8:26.

Staffing and Hours of Operation

- Lifeguard operations will fall under the supervision and operational command of Sea Bright Ocean Rescue.
- One Ocean Rescue supervisor will provide daily oversight of operations.
- Two beachés will be guarded full time (7 days/week) starting on Saturday, June 17th to Monday, September 4th, 2023.
 - o Snug Harbor
 - o Miller Street
- One lifeguard stand per beach staffed from 10:00 am until 4:00 pm 7 days a week.
- Snug Harbor will be assigned (2) two USLA qualified open water beach lifeguards and Miller Street will be assigned (2) USLA qualified open water beach lifeguard until roughly August 14th. There will also be a roving duty supervisor between Sea Bright and the Highlands.
- August 14th to Labor Day staffing may drop to only one lifeguard per beach during the weekdays
 dependent on available personnel. Our roster will be unknown until 2023 candidates are
 evaluated, hired, and trained. Although we reserve the right to do this, staffing has not been an
 issue and we do not anticipate any problems this summer.
- Bay and River rescue services and advanced rescue response from Sea Bright's Aquatic Response Rescue Team 24 hours a day becomes available to Highlands.
- Highlands would be expected to maintain a safe and clean beach; free of large or sharp jagged debris.
- Highlands would be expected to perform routine maintenance on lifeguard stands.
- Highlands would be expected to provide appropriate storage at Snug Harbor beach for rescue equipment.
- Highlands would be expected to provide appropriate signage.
- Sea Bright Ocean Rescue will hold the exclusive right to determine condition flags and water closure.

Lifeguard Training and Certification

- Each of Sea Bright's Lifeguards no matter rank or assignment will attend well over 40 hours of a USLA compliant open water lifesaving training program.
- Re-current/returning lifeguards complete at least 16 hours of annual rescue and medical refresher training.
- Completion of a 500 meter open water (surf) swim completed in less than 10 minutes.
- Maintain annual physician clearance of sound health, and possess necessary physical abilities to perform the duty of an ocean or river lifeguard.
- Each ocean lifeguard will hold the following professional level of certification:
 - AHA Basic Life Support for Health Care Professionals or equivalent level
 - AHA, ASHI or ARC Lifeguard / First Aid Certification
 - 20 hours of additional and 8 hours per year of Aquatic Medical Response Training
- Ocean Rescue supervisors will maintain all training and certification of a front line Ocean Lifeguard with the following additional certifications and training:
 - State or National certification as a Paramedic, EMT or EMR
 - FEMA Incident Command Courses IC 100 IC 700 and IC 800
 - Rescue Water Craft Operator or Crewman
 - Completion of annual EVOC training (emergency vehicle operations course)

Lifeguard and Rescue Services

- Water surveillance and risk reduction of drowning and/or traumatic injury.
- Water rescue response either in open water or swift water (guarded area)
- Code-X missing swimmer search and rescue (still water)
- First -Aid to the sick and injured within the staffed beach areas
- Emergent resuscitation of ill or injured patrons within the staffed beach areas
- Emergency medical care and ambulance coordination within the boundaries of the staffed beach and bathing areas.
- Coordination and resource management of major water related emergencies (Lifeguard Supervisor)
 - Capsized boat or water craft with swimmers in distress
 - Rescue response to swimmers outside of guarded areas (swift water)
 - Assist Injured swimmers and boaters unguarded areas of Highlands
 - Assessment and safety management of dangerous aquatic life

Lifeguard Rescue Equipment and Medical Supplies

- Docked and Prepped PWC = \$3,000 (includes labor, fuel, and maintenance)
- Rescue Board \$1000.00
- Marine warning flags = $(8 \text{ Flags}) \times \$23.50 = \$188.00$
- Surf Rescue Fins (4) x \$100.00 \$400.00
- Medical kit (2) x \$175.00= \$350.00
- Uniforms (7) x \$200.00 = \$1400.00
- Gas for Vehicle \$500.00
- Total = \$6838 in Equipment/Supplies (No Change in Proposal)

Personnel

- Sea Bright Ocean Rescue will add 7 Lifeguards to its roster to meet the need of properly supervising the two beaches in the Highlands.
- A total of 4 Lifeguards will be assigned to Highlands beaches (with a roving supervisor) from Saturday, June 17th to Monday, September 4th, 2023 (7 days/week).
- $4 \times 14.50/hr = 58.00 \times 8 \text{ hours/day} = 464/day \times 80 \text{ days} = 37,120$
- $1 \times 18.50/hr = 18.50 \times 4 \text{ hours/day } 74/day \times 80 \text{ days} = 55,920$
- Total = \$43,040 Rescue Personnel Salaries (Increase of \$1,440)

Beach Maintenance

- Holland Raking of Snug Harbor beach 1x per week (3 hours per raking) including labor, fuel, and maintenance \$60.00 / hour x 3 = \$180.00 / week \$180.00 x 15 weeks = \$2,700
- Total = \$2,700 -we do our own beach cleaning
- *** In the event that Highlands requests an extra raking of the beaches, this request will be accepted (if DPW schedule permits), at a cost of \$300 / extra raking.
